Challenges and Progress towards SDG 5



- Different realities/diverse sub-regions within the region
- Changing political and economic landscape
- Persistent high levels of inequalities
- Feminization of poverty
- Change of political cycle many elections coming
- Middle to low levels of women's political participation
- Persisting high levels of VAW and feminicide
- Overlapping and distinct forms of VAW
- Women not considered as essential to reduce risks in events of Climate change and disaster.



Governance and Economic Empowerment



Governance and political participation: PARITY ONLY:

- Mexico Constitutional reform for parity at all levels approved
- 18 countries with a parity or quota laws
- 30.7% of women in lower chambers
- 6 Parity Cabinets (Peru, Colombia, Costa Rica, Nicaragua, El Salvador, Mexico)
- **Dominican Republic:** 8 public institutions track resources for GEWE in their budget



Women's economic empowerment: Private Sector and SMEs

- **Win-Win** project in Argentina, Brazil, Chile, Costa Rica, Jamaica, Uruguay: total 449 WEPs signatories; launch of Gender Pay Gap tool and of innovative financing mechanism
- **Bolivia:** More than 500 women's entrepreneurs trained in business development in 2018
- **Chile**: Originarias programa: 300 indigenous women entrepreneurs supported in North Chile (Teck)
- **Guatemala:** more than 1,500 indigenous rural women increased their income in 2018

Ending Violence Against Women







Elimination of violence against women and access to justice: **END IMPUNITY** and **PREVENT**

- Launch of UN-EU Spotlight initiative in Argentina, El Salvador, Guatemala, Honduras and Mexico; (Combined target to reach nearly 25M people); Caribbean Spotlight under development Model law on femicide approved by OAS
- Training on gender-sensitive administration of justice for judges with the Caribbean Court of Justice and Sexual Offences Model Court in Antigua and Barbuda (Jurist project funded by Canada)
- More than 260 women in preventive detention in Haiti received legal assistance in 2018
- Safe cities programme implemented in 16 cities in 8 LAC countries (BOL, COL, ECU, GUA, HON, MEX, RD, URU)
- Violence prevention through sports and self-esteem for girls (IOC, CAF): Argentina, Brasil, Chile and Uruguay

Migration, Climate Change and Peace Building







Human mobility

- Bi-national programme **Colombia/Ecuador** to address gender-based violence and trafficking
- Programmes to address Venezuelan women's migrants needs in Colombia and Brazil

Climate change and disaster risk

- **Ecuador**: Rural women from the Province of Azuay developed Sustainable Development Community Plans
- **Guatemala**: Delivery of emergency kits for women affected by the volcano eruption in 2018
- **Early warning** with Directorate of Civil Protection in Haiti and with CDEMA in English speaking Caribbean
- Immediate disaster response: English speaking Caribbean and Haiti, Central America, Chile, Colombia Ecuador, and Mexico

Peace Building Fund

 17,028 beneficiaries in 4 countries (Colombia, Ecuador, Guatemala, Haiti

From Rio to the World: Women, Girls and Sport









"I've learned that I have my own identity. That I must understand myself, get to know my own body and protect who I am."

Results from Rio include:

- 89% of girls said they were a leader, compared to 46% before the programme
- 93% of girls know where to report violence
- 79% of girls now know how to prevent pregnancy, compared to 25% before
- 77% of girls now know how to prevent sexually transmitted infections, compared to 21% before

- New concepts and models: gender in climate change adaptation and mitigation; tools for gender equality in the private sector; leadership school for women entrepreneurship; social innovation initiative; campaigns and programmes for cultural change
- Cross-border peacebuilding and crisis response programmes; sub-regional programmes and multi-country initiatives with strong South-South, North-South and knowledge sharing components

- Pro-bono PR and media
 partnerships and networks for social and behaviour change
- Innovative Financing facility:
 regional mechanism to: 1) facilitate
 funding to women entrepreneurs,

 among financial institutions





- Importance of global pooled funds (PBF) and private sector funding
- Increased engagement in joint programmes (more than 50% of our programmes in LAC)
- Sustainability of UNW relies on a combination of Government cost-sharing, private funding and "traditional donors" funding.
