*Brigid Inder is the Executive Director of the Women's Initiatives for Gender Justice. In August 2012, Ms. Inder was appointed as the Special Advisor on Gender to the Prosecutor of the International Criminal Court. For over twenty-five years, she has led successful political and legal advocacy strategies for accountability for genderbased crimes before the International Criminal Court, domestic Courts and transitional justice mechanisms. In June 2014, Ms. Inder was awarded an OBE for services to women's rights and international justice.

Since 1996, the UN Trust Fund has awarded over \$103 million in grants to 393 vital projects in 135 countries.
