Target Population
This programme is expected to have a direct impact on women and their dependents in two urban and six rural markets in Liberia.


General Programme Goal
Enhanced access to economic resources and opportunities for market women and their families in Liberia.

Expected Programme Outcomes
<p>Outcome 1: Decent work and a healthy environment for market women in Liberia. Decent work, by the ILO definition, reflects an individual's aspirations for opportunity and income, rights, voice and recognition, family stability and personal development, fairness and gender equality. Decent work is essential to poverty reduction.</p> <p>Outcome 2: Increased opportunities for market women to access skills and credit for their livelihood so that they can support their families and contribute to the development of Liberia. Market women include women and girls, those in the informal sector, rural women producers, women agricultural workers, and impoverished women.</p> <p>Outcome 3: Enhanced capability of government ministries and other relevant organizations to undertake multi-dimensional, collaborative and integrated planning and programming that supports market women's economic development and leadership.</p>

Government ministries include Ministry of Public Works, Ministry of Lands, Mines and Energy, Ministry for Gender and Development. Other organizations include the Liberian Marketing Association and NGOs that focus on literacy training and micro credit.

Outcome 4: Robust program monitoring and evaluation coupled with learning and sharing of experiences and lessons learned. This information will help government ministries and other relevant organizations plan and implement future programs to advance women's economic empowerment and leadership in Liberia's informal sector.

Programme Summary
<p>The program seeks to work with a large number of poor rural women, including over two-thirds from Scheduled Tribes and Castes, organized into self-help groups (SHGs) and their solidarity associations; in four states of India beset with endemic poverty; to enhance and institutionalize their effective economic and political participation impacting their status in family and community including engagement in local government bodies. These are also the goals enshrined in the National Policy for Empowerment of Women 2001, and the 11th Five Year Plan of the Government of India. The program would work intensively with 75,000 women in four states and train large numbers of them to become community resources. It would also document and analyze lessons learnt and policy constraints highlighted by this program at the grassroots level and bring that information to bear on government policies.</p>

Target Population
<p>The program will work intensively with 75,000 rural women from marginalized communities (tribals, dalits and others) in nine districts of India; 125 local youth (men and women) in 9 districts in 4 states of India; 300 women's collectives; 1,000 local self governance representatives and government functionaries and officials as well as 100 panchayats (at various levels from the village to the state).</p>

General Programme Goal
<p>75,000 rural women from marginalized communities (tribals, dalits and others) and their collectives, in the endemic poverty pockets of nine districts in four states of Central India, will increasingly exercise their constitutional rights to access mainstream livelihood resources and opportunities, participate in local self-governance structures, and speak against violations in the home and their immediate environment. These are their rights under the mandates of the National Policy for Empowerment of Women and other relevant state policies.</p>

### **Expected Programme Outcomes**

Outcome 1: 75,000 rural women from marginalised communities (tribals, dalits and others) in 9 districts of India, increasingly exercise their right to participate in local governance structures, institutions and processes, by the end of the programme.

Outcome 2: 300 women's collectives covering 75,000 women from tribal and dalit communities at village and sub-block levels, help women with communications skills so that they can address issues of inequality, discrimination and violations they face in their homes and elsewhere, by the end of the programme.

Outcome 3: 45,000 women SHG members from tribal and dalit communities in endemic poverty pockets of nine districts, display an enhanced sense of equality as their economic power in the household grows.

Outcome 4: At least 1000 local self governance representatives and government functionaries and officials (at various levels from the village to the state) in five districts in three states, exhibit more sensitivity to the demands of marginalized women under constitutional requirements and entitlements of NPEW and relevant state policies, by the end of the programme.

Programme Summary
In the framework of the General Law for Equality between Women and Men and the Federal Law for Electoral Institutions and Procedures, Equidad de Género: Ciudadanía, Trabajo y Familia, in collaboration with three other Mexican NGOs and the National Women's Institute, will increase the number of Mexican women in public office in nine states that implement public policy or programs in favor of an economic agenda for women. By the end of the project period we expect a significant quantitative and qualitative increase in the number and abilities of congresswomen, women municipal presidents, municipal counselors and municipal auditors as well as the number of women public officials in high-level posts.

In the framework of the General Law for Equality between Women and Men and the Federal Law for Electoral Institutions and Procedures, increase the number of Mexican women in public office in nine states that implement public policy or programs in favor of an economic agenda for women.



Target Population
This programme is expected to have a direct impact on individual rural women and their families in 120 villages throughout Rwanda as well as in neighboring towns. In addition, it will target 65 key members (operating at national and regional level) of women's organizations and GMOs; as well as 1,248 members of women's organizations (including NWC).

General Programme Goal
Rural women in all 30 districts of Rwanda are economically and politically empowered to exercise and secure their land rights as guaranteed by the Inheritance Law of 1999, the Land Law of 2005, the GBV Law of 2009 and international law ratified by the state of Rwanda.


Expected Programme Outcomes
Outcome 1: By the end of the programme more individual rural women in all districts of Rwanda will be more effective in claiming and defending their land rights before formal and informal local-level dispute resolution institutions.
Outcome 2: By the end of the program the national government institutions (MINELA, NLC and MIGEPROFE) will take further steps to

align domestic law with women's rights under international law. They will include solutions to the eliminate problems that rural women currently encounter in exercising and securing their land rights in secondary legislation. Local authorities at district and sector-level will do the same.

Outcome 3: By the end of the program, male and female community leaders and other community members in 840 villages in all districts of Rwanda, increasinly overcome cultural and legal barriers that prevent rural women from exercising and securing their legally protected land rights.
