
# WOMEN'S RIGHTS AND THE LAW: A REPORT CARD\*

### EQUALITY BEFORE THE LAW BEGINS WITH THE CONSTITUTION



Of the **44 constitutional** monarchies in existence, **27** are strictly patrilineal.





While **192 countries** guarantee participation in the political affairs of the State, only **25** mandate quotas as a means to achieving gender equality in politics.

### MANY LAWS STILL DISCRIMINATE IN MATTERS OF MARRIAGE, DIVORCE AND PROPERTY RIGHTS



### IN TOO MANY COUNTRIES, THE LAW ALLOWS FOR EARLY AND CHILD MARRIAGE, WHICH ERODES THE FULL POTENTIAL OF ABOUT 12 MILLION GIRLS ANNUALLY



### WOMEN ARE NOT EQUAL BEFORE THE LAW IN THE WORLD OF WORK, RESTRICTING THEIR PRODUCTIVE AND EARNING CAPACITIES

# In **Z** COUNTRIES,

women are not entitled to paid maternity leave of at least 14 weeks (ILO standard)




In **78** COUNTRIES, fathers do not have access to paid leave

### EQUAL NATIONALITY RIGHTS PROMOTE FAMILY COHESION AND ENSURE ACCESS TO BASIC SOCIAL SERVICES

However, in **47 countries** a married woman cannot confer nationality to her noncitizen **spouse** on the same basis as a married man.

In **25 countries**, women are unable to pass on their nationality to their **children** in the same way as men.

- A woman cannot pass on her nationality to both her noncitizen spouse and child
- A woman cannot pass on her nationality to her children
