

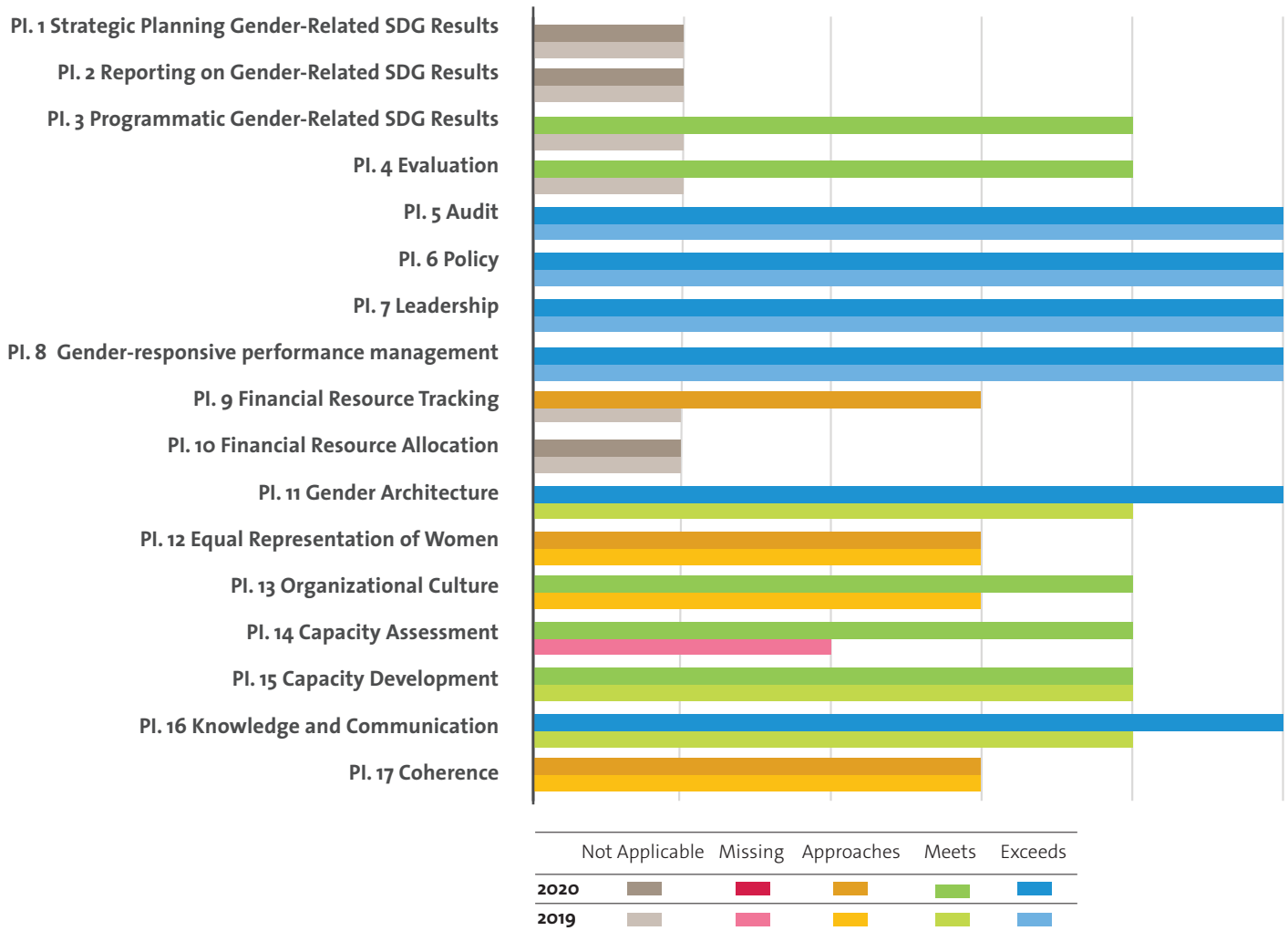

UN-SWAP 2.0 PERFORMANCE 2020

The following three pages capture DSS' performance on UN-SWAP 2.0 indicators for 2020.

In 2020, DSS met or exceeded the requirements for 11 performance indicators out of 14 applicable, a significant improvement in comparison with 2019 performance.

Most significant gains

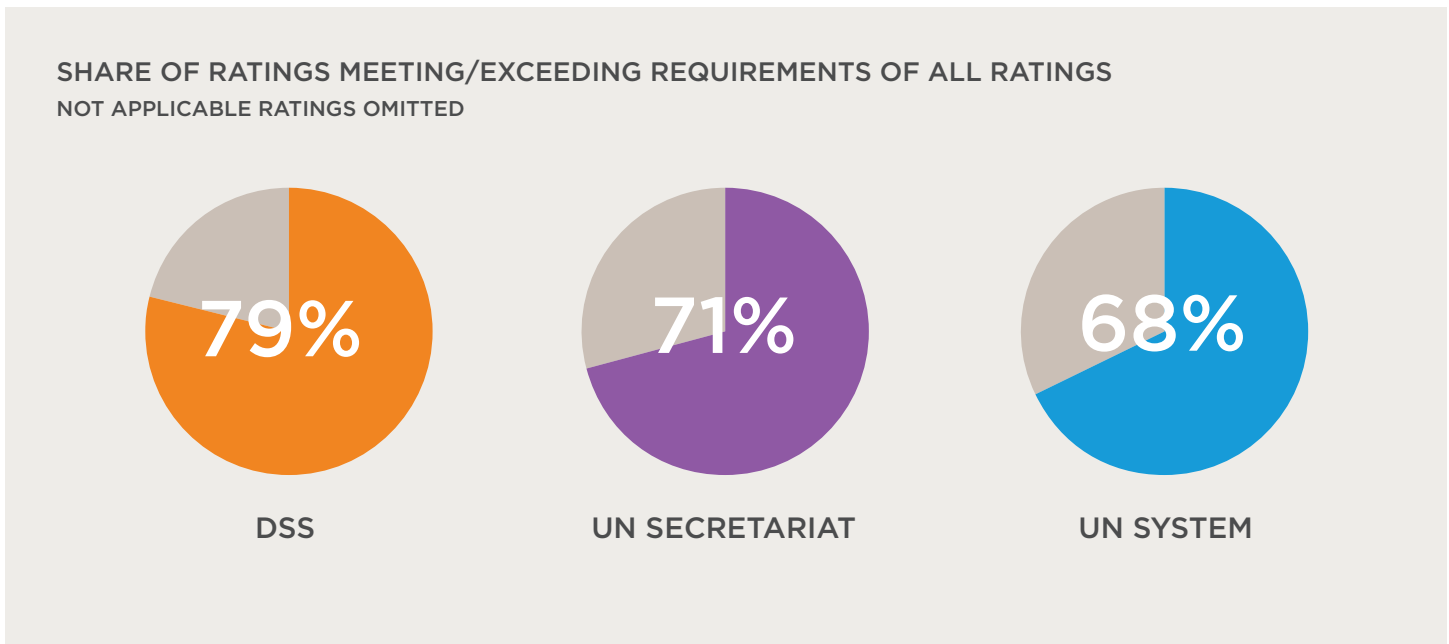
- DSS newly exceeded the requirements for Gender architecture and Knowledge and communication, while maintaining strong performance on Policy and Leadership, among other indicators.
- We commend DSS for reassessing the applicability of three indicators.

Areas for improvement

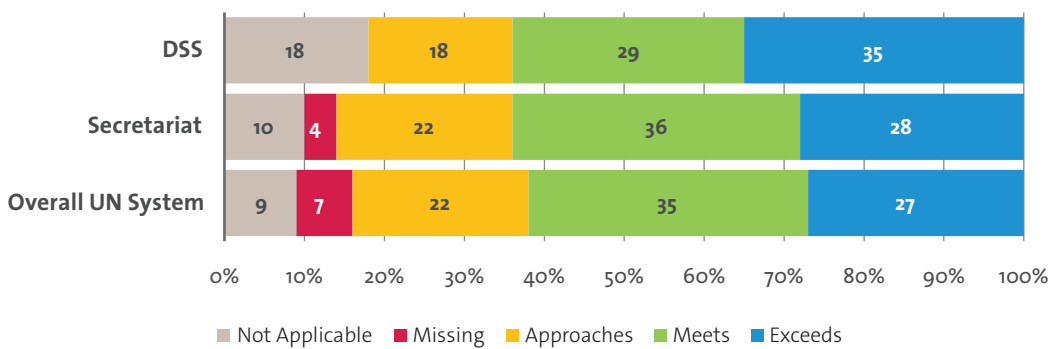
- UN Women encourages DSS to prioritise the three indicators that were rated as approaching requirements: Financial resource tracking, Equal representation of women and Coherence.

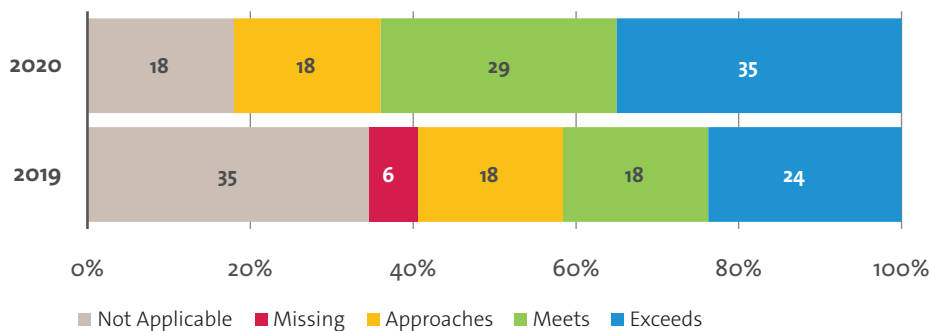


COMPARISON WITH SECRETARIAT ENTITIES AND THE OVERALL UN SYSTEM



- In 2020, DSS met or exceeded requirements for more indicators than both the average for the UN Secretariat and the overall UN system.
- DSS rated 18 per cent of indicators as not applicable. In comparison, on average the UN Secretariat and the overall UN system rated 10 and 9 per cent of indicators as not applicable, respectively.

DSS, COMPARATIVE ANALYSIS OF RATINGS BY YEAR



- In 2020, DSS met or exceeded requirements for 64 per cent of indicators, a significant 22-percentage point increase from 2019.
