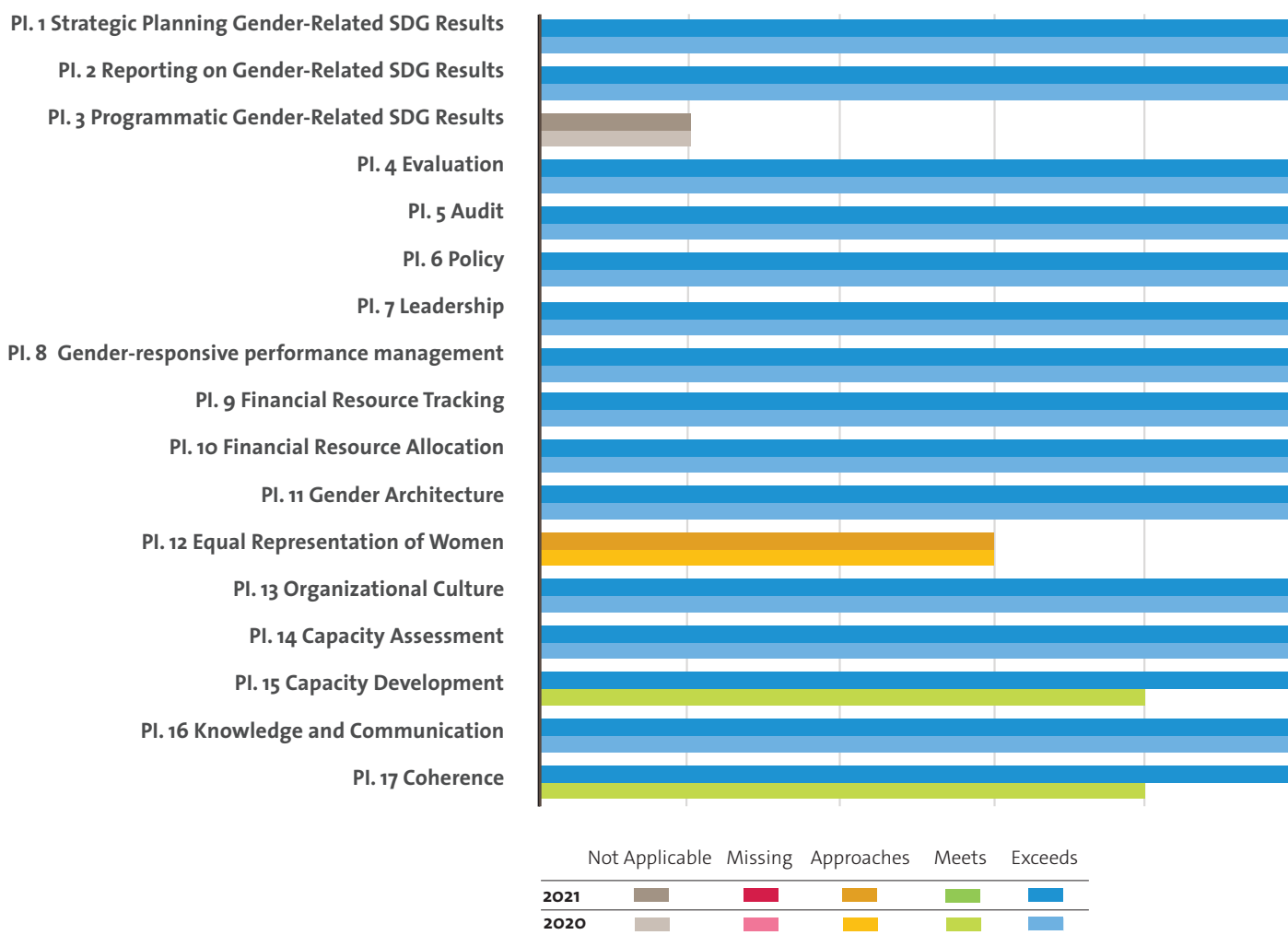
UN-SWAP 2.0 PERFORMANCE 2021

The following two pages capture ESCWA's performance on UN-SWAP 2.0 indicators for 2021.

In 2021, ESCWA exceeded the requirements for 15 performance indicators out of 16 applicable.

ESCWA's progress towards meeting UN-SWAP 2.0 requirements is significantly above average.

Most significant gains

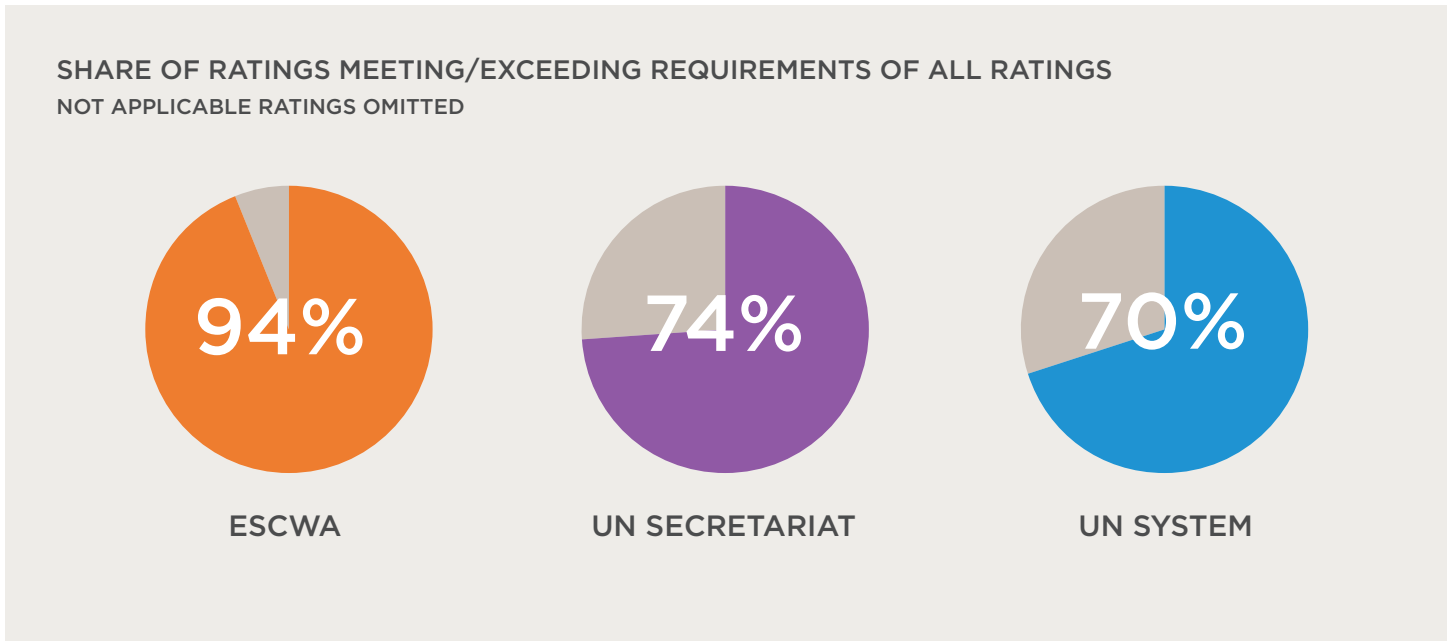
- In 2021, ESCWA exceeded requirements for 15 indicators, an outstanding achievement.
- ESCWA has surpassed its exemplary 2020 results by newly exceeding requirements for two indicators: Capacity development and Coherence. UN Women commends ESCWA for its tireless dedication to advancing gender equality and the empowerment of women.

Areas for improvement

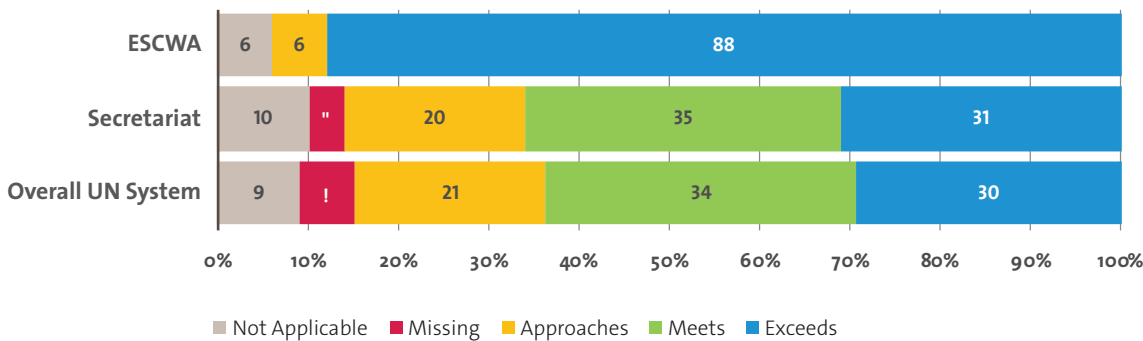
- UN Women encourages ESCWA to focus on the only indicator rated as approaching requirements: Equal representation of women, to solidify its place among few entities positioned to reach full compliance in the current UN-SWAP implementation period.

COMPARATIVE ANALYSIS FOR ESCWA



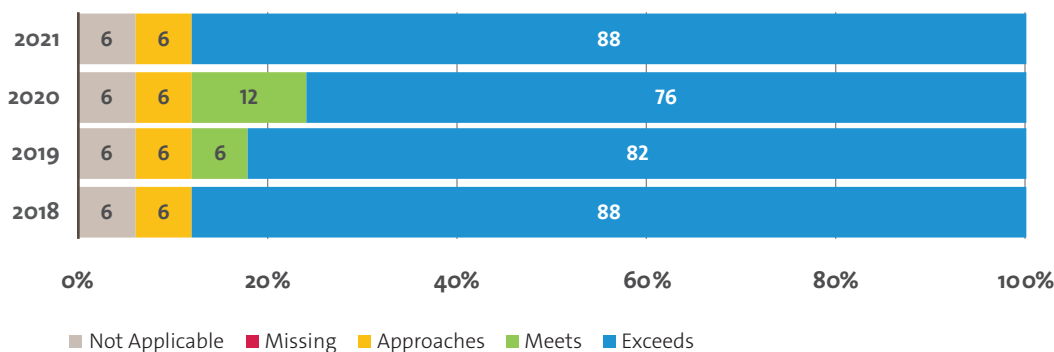
COMPARISON WITH THE SECRETARIAT AS A WHOLE AND THE OVERALL UN SYSTEM



In 2021, ESCWA’s exemplary performance was significantly stronger than the average results of the UN Secretariat and the UN System as a whole.

ESCWA evaluated fewer indicators as not applicable than similar entities and the overall UN system.

ESCWA, COMPARATIVE ANALYSIS OF RATINGS BY YEAR



In 2021, ESCWA exceeded requirements for two additional indicators, matching the highest performance achieved in 2018, the first year of UN-SWAP 2.0 implementation.

ESCWA maintained its overall strong performance across all areas of the UN-SWAP 2.0.
