

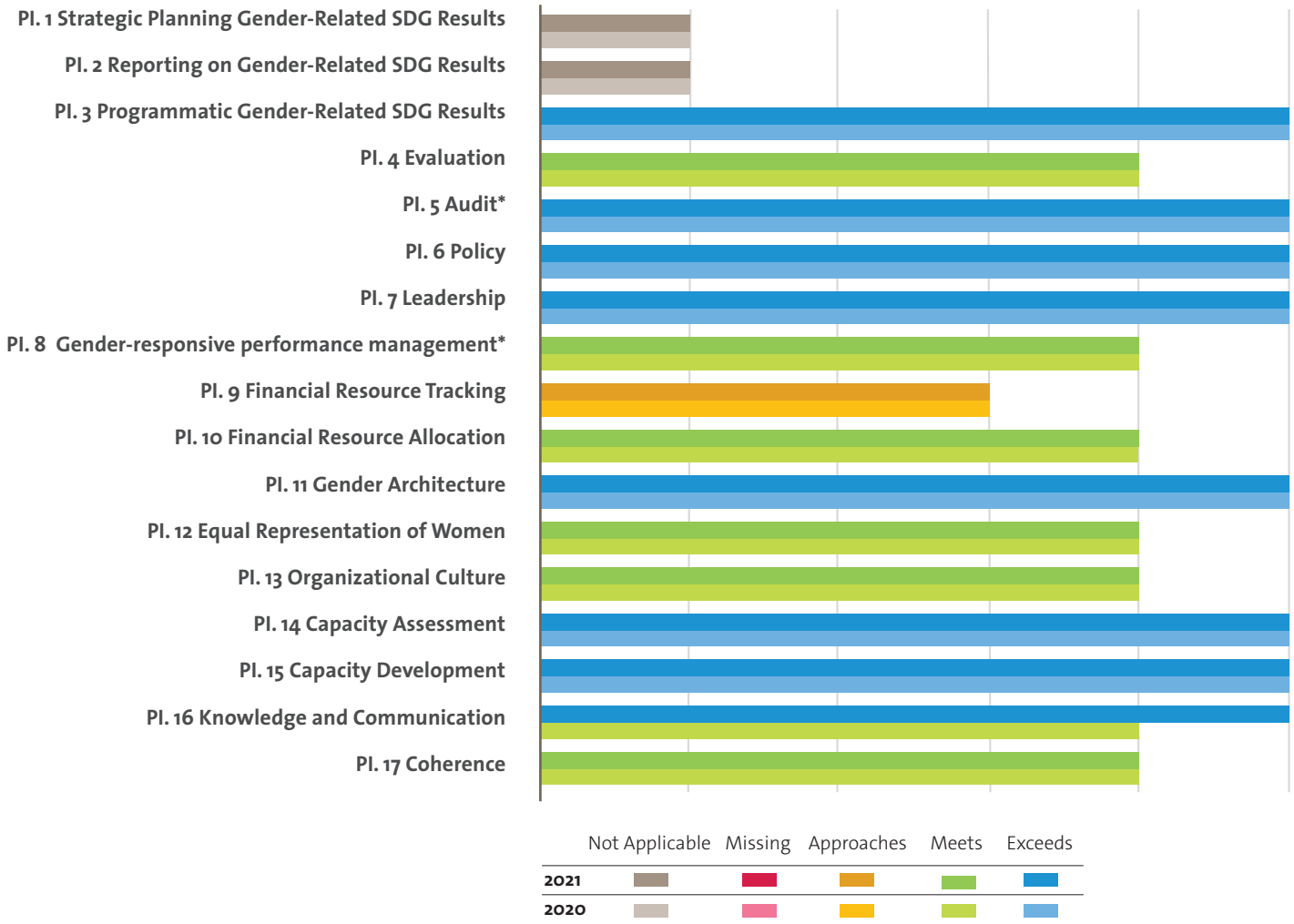

## UN-SWAP 2.0 PERFORMANCE 2021

The following two pages capture OLA's performance on UN-SWAP 2.0 indicators for 2021.

In 2021, OLA met or exceeded the requirements for 14 performance indicators out of 15 applicable, a significant improvement from 2020 results.

PERFORMANCE HIGHLIGHTS IN 2021

Most significant gains

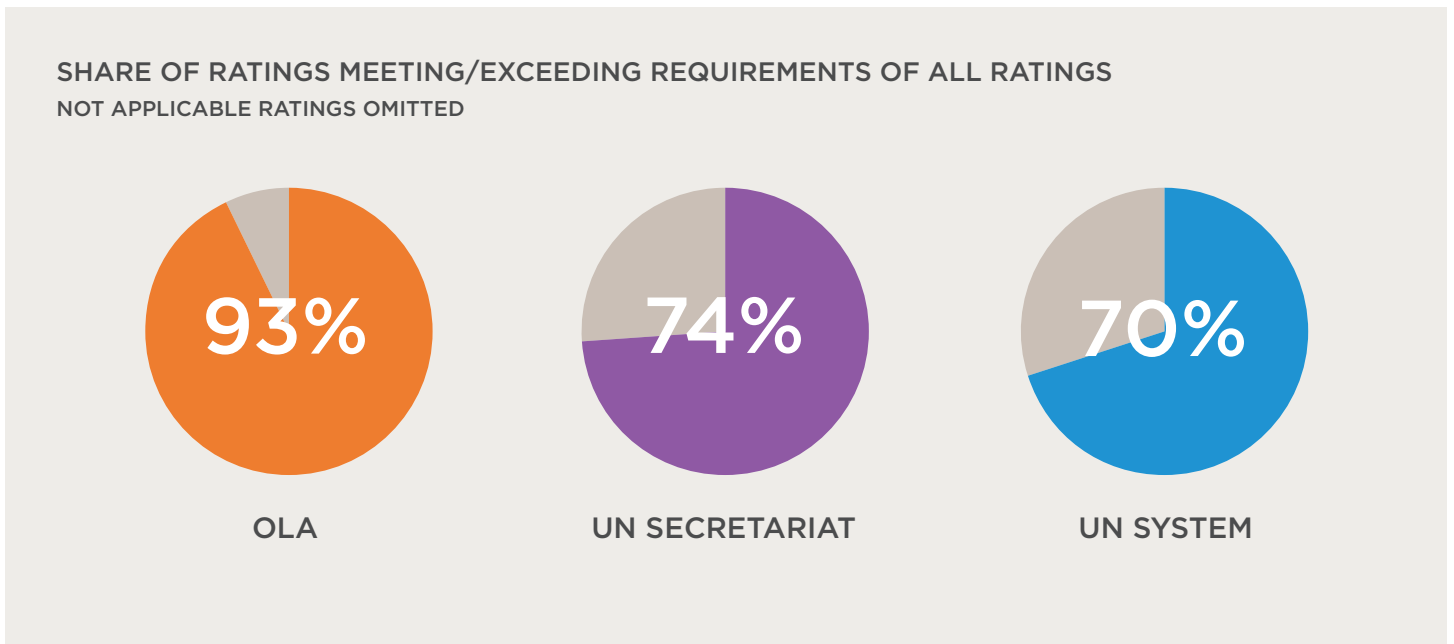
- In 2021, OLA exceeded the requirements for eight indicators and met them for another six indicators.
- Significantly, OLA newly exceeded the requirements in the area of Knowledge and communication, a critical tool to cement gender equality principles as a core component of the work of OLA.

Areas for improvement

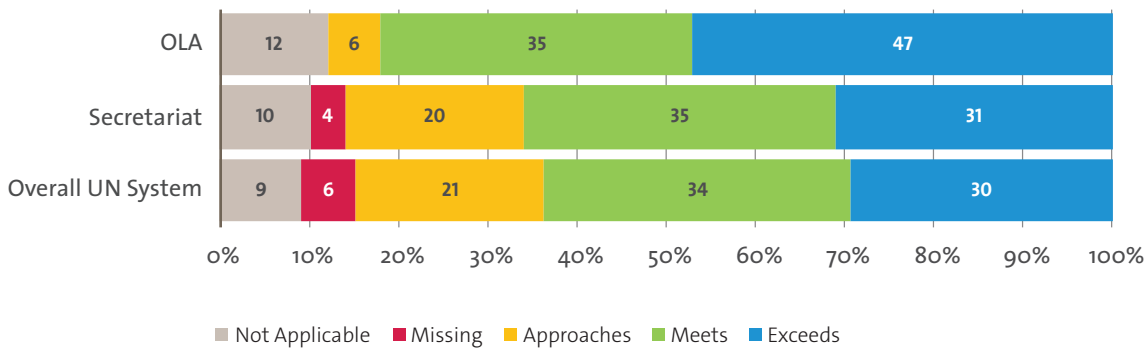
- Renewed attention to the only indicator still approaching requirements, Financial resource tracking, will position OLA to attain full compliance in the current UN-SWAP implementation period.

COMPARATIVE ANALYSIS FOR OLA



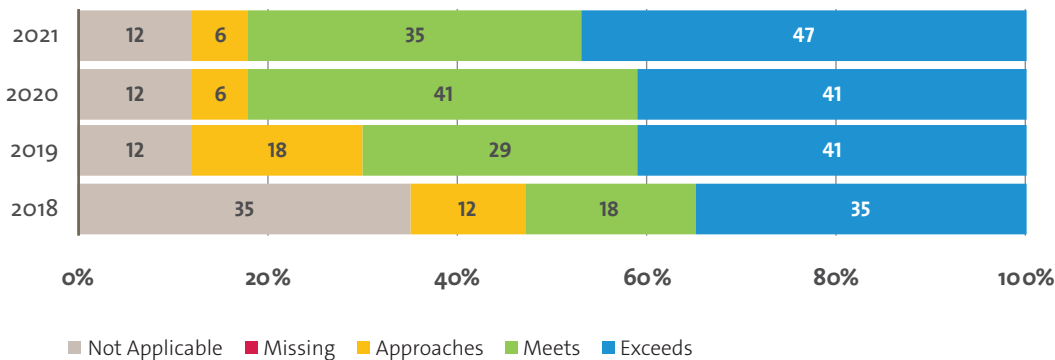
COMPARISON WITH THE SECRETARIAT AS A WHOLE AND THE OVERALL UN SYSTEM
