

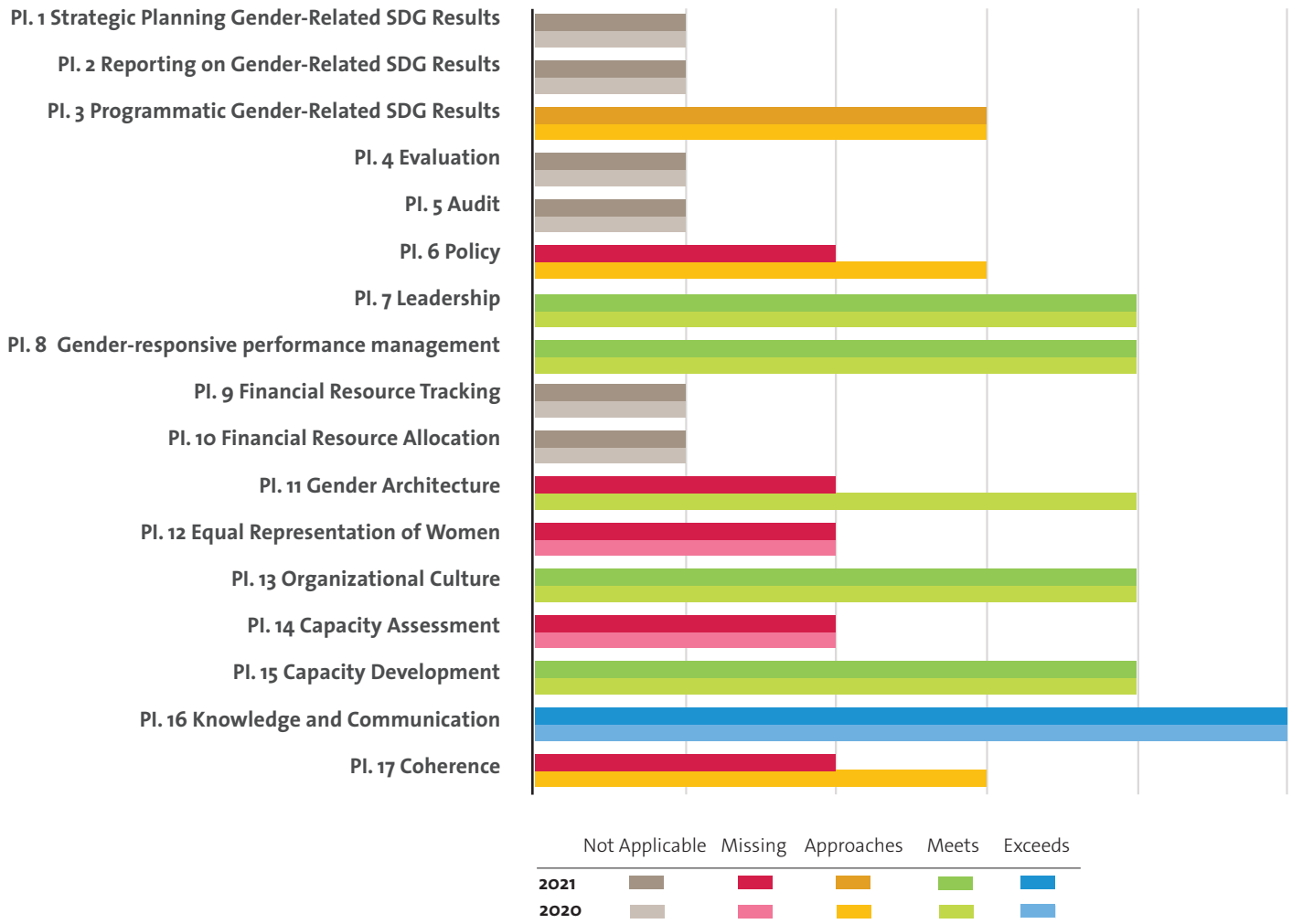

Most significant gains

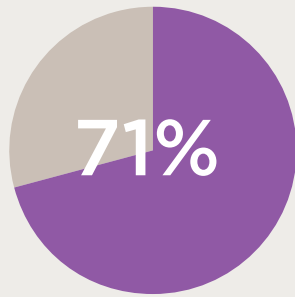
- In 2021, UNICRI exceeded the requirements for one indicator and met them for another four indicators.
- Importantly, UNICRI exceeded the requirements in the area of Knowledge and communication and continued to meet the Leadership indicator.

Areas for improvement

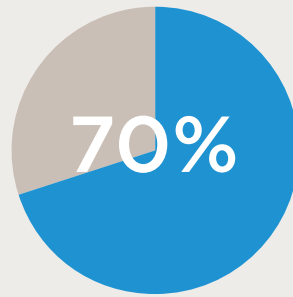
- UN Women encourages UNICRI to focus on the four indicators rated as missing requirements and the one indicator rated as approaching requirements: Programmatic Gender-related SDG results.
- In particular, UNICRI is encouraged to recapture lost gains in the area of Gender architecture.
- The development of a comprehensive Gender Equality Policy will drive progress across several areas.

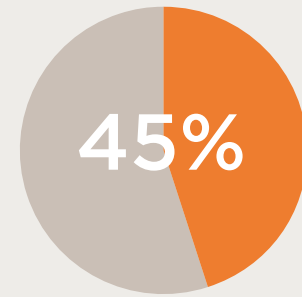
SHARE OF RATINGS MEETING/EXCEEDING REQUIREMENTS OF ALL RATINGS

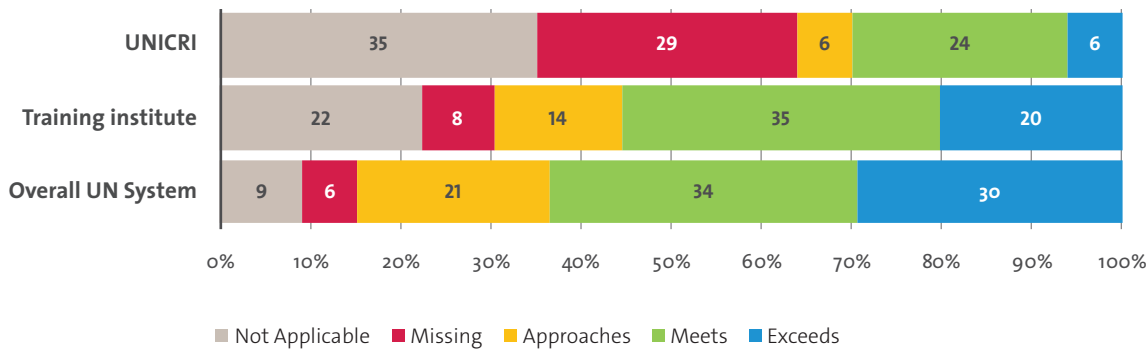

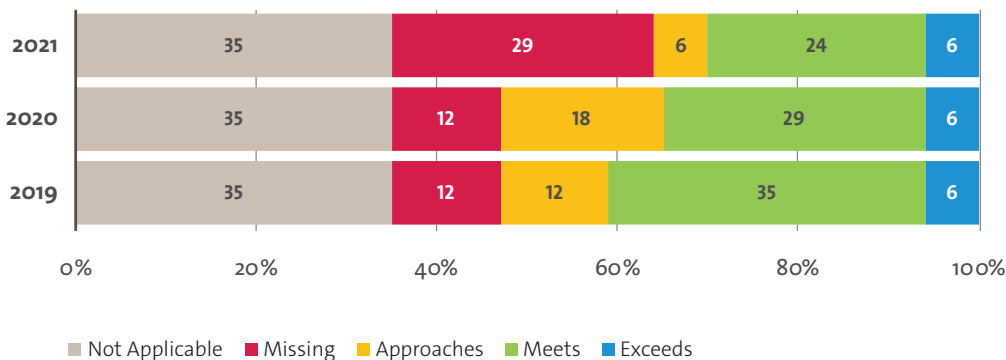
COMPARISON WITH SPECIALIZED ENTITIES AND THE OVERALL UN SYSTEM



In 2021, UNICRI's UN-SWAP 2.0 performance fell short of the average results of Training institutes and the overall UN system.

Comparatively, UNICRI rated a larger share of indicators as not applicable or missing requirements than similar entities or the UN system as a whole.

UNICRI, COMPARATIVE ANALYSIS OF RATINGS BY YEAR



In its third year of reporting, UNICRI met or exceeded the requirements of less indicators than previous years.

Five indicators are rated as missing requirements, a significant increase from 2020.
