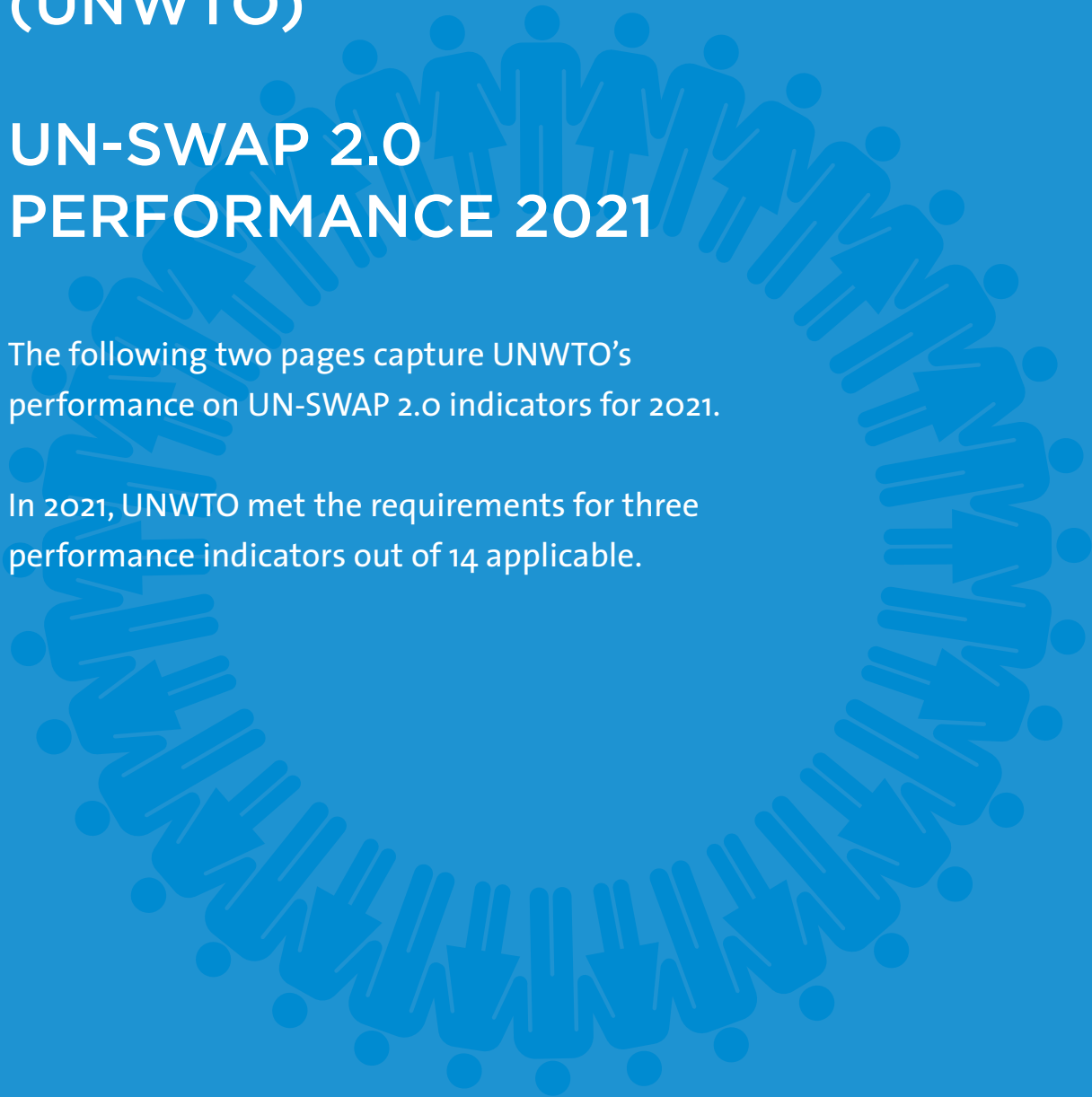

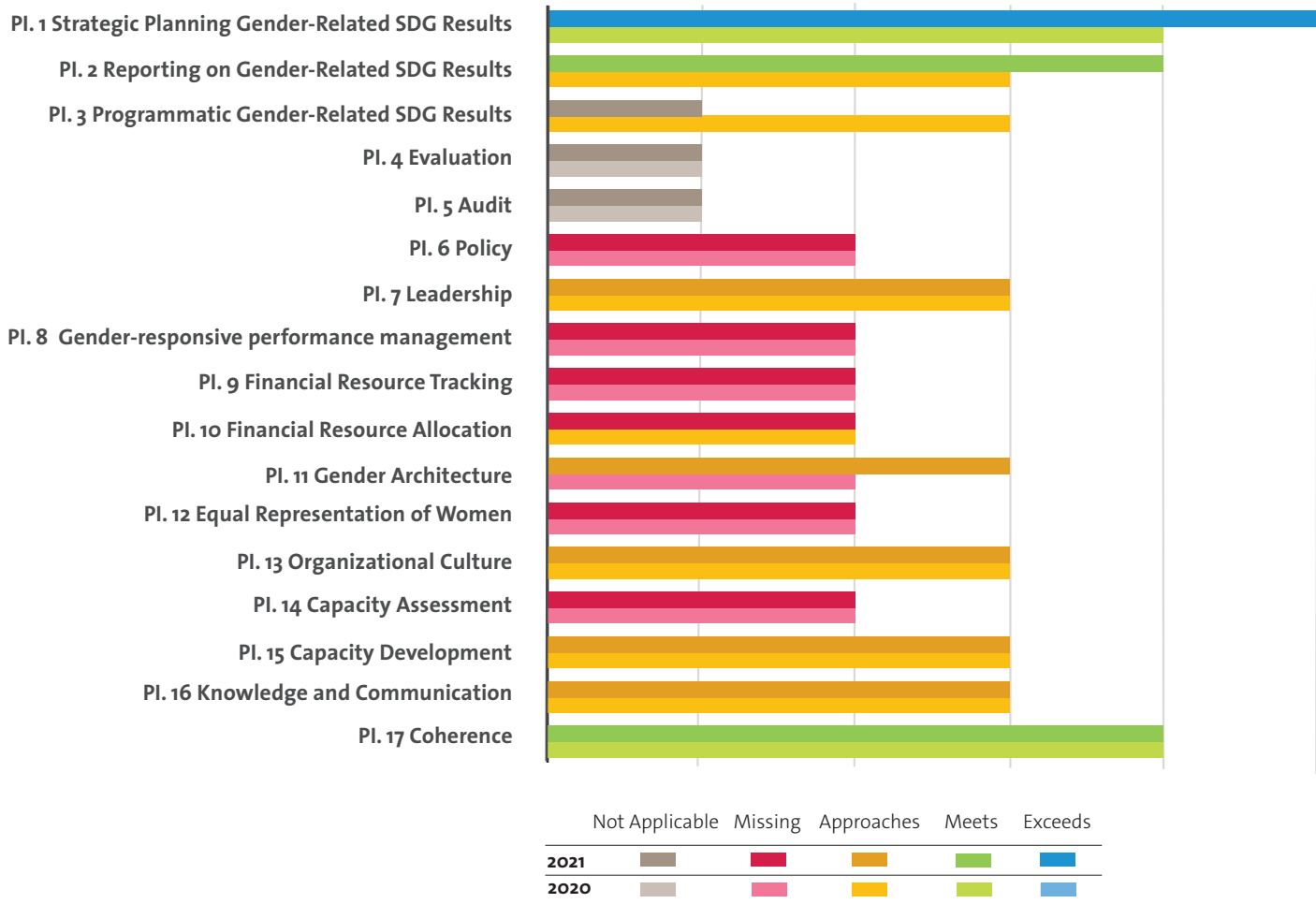
UN-SWAP 2.0 PERFORMANCE 2021

PERFORMANCE HIGHLIGHTS IN 2021

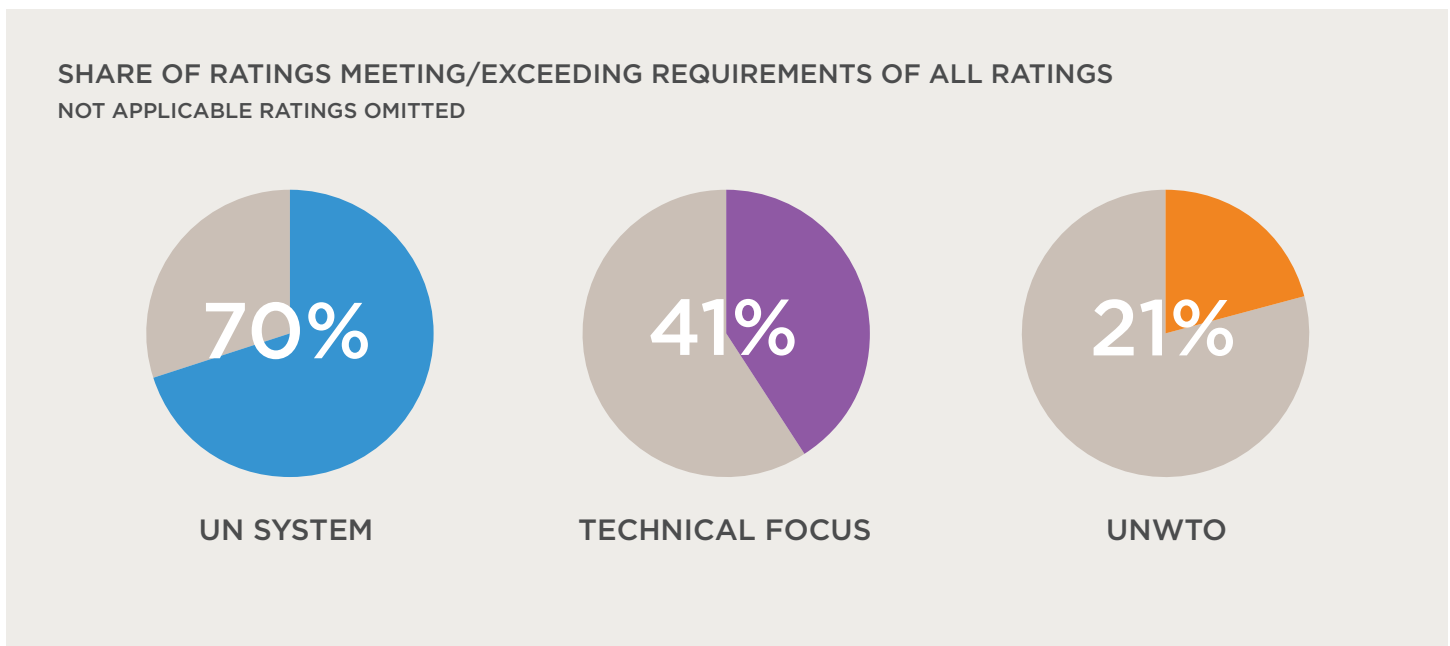
Most significant gains

- In 2021, UNWTO exceeded the requirements for one indicator and met the requirements for two other indicators.
- Significantly, UNWTO newly exceeded the requirements for Strategic planning gender-related SDG results and newly met them for Reporting on gender-related SDG results.

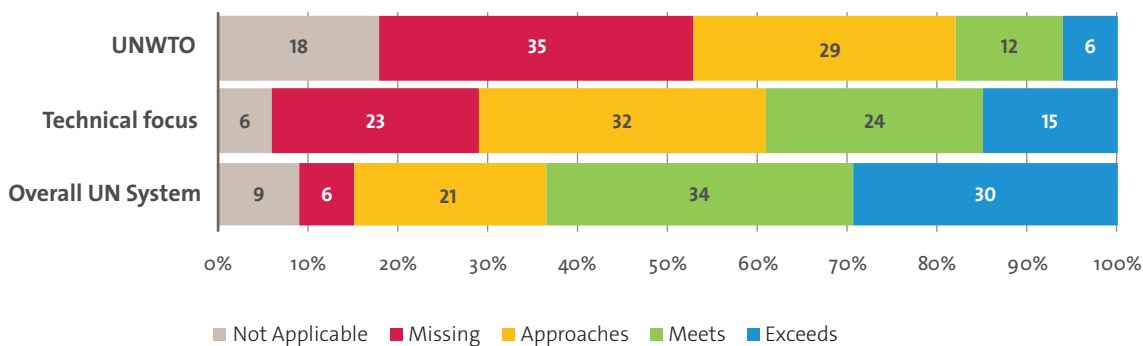
Areas for improvement

- UN Women encourages UNWTO to focus on some of the six indicators missing requirements and five indicators approaching requirements.
- In particular, UNWTO is encouraged to develop a gender equality policy. Gender policies have been identified as overall drivers of progress that can support UNWTO in accelerating progress toward compliance in the current UN-SWAP implementation period.

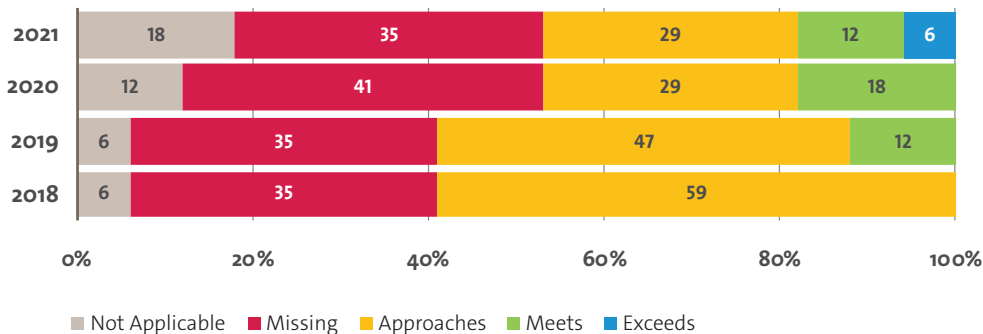


COMPARISON WITH TECHNICAL FOCUS ENTITIES AND THE OVERALL UN SYSTEM



In 2021, UNWTO trailed the performance of the combined results of entities with a technical focus and of the overall UN system.

In 2021, UNWTO exceeded requirements for one indicator for the first time since the start of UN-SWAP 2.0 implementation in 2018.

UNWTO rated an increasing number of indicators as not applicable, three in 2021.
