## Addendum to Background Note as of 18 January 2023

## UN-Women updated management actions on the recommendations of the United Nations Board of Auditors for 2021: Status of implementation

- 1. In paragraph 3, UN-Women has further increased to 63 per cent (from 59 per cent) the completed actions of the outstanding recommendations as of 31 December 2021 or 17 (from 16) of the total 27 recommendations, [i.e., 8 remaining prior year (2020) recommendations plus 19 newly issued in 2021].
- 2. Under paragraph 48 and in Table 3, data under the columns "Closure requested", "Under implementation", and "Closed by UNBoA" were updated.
