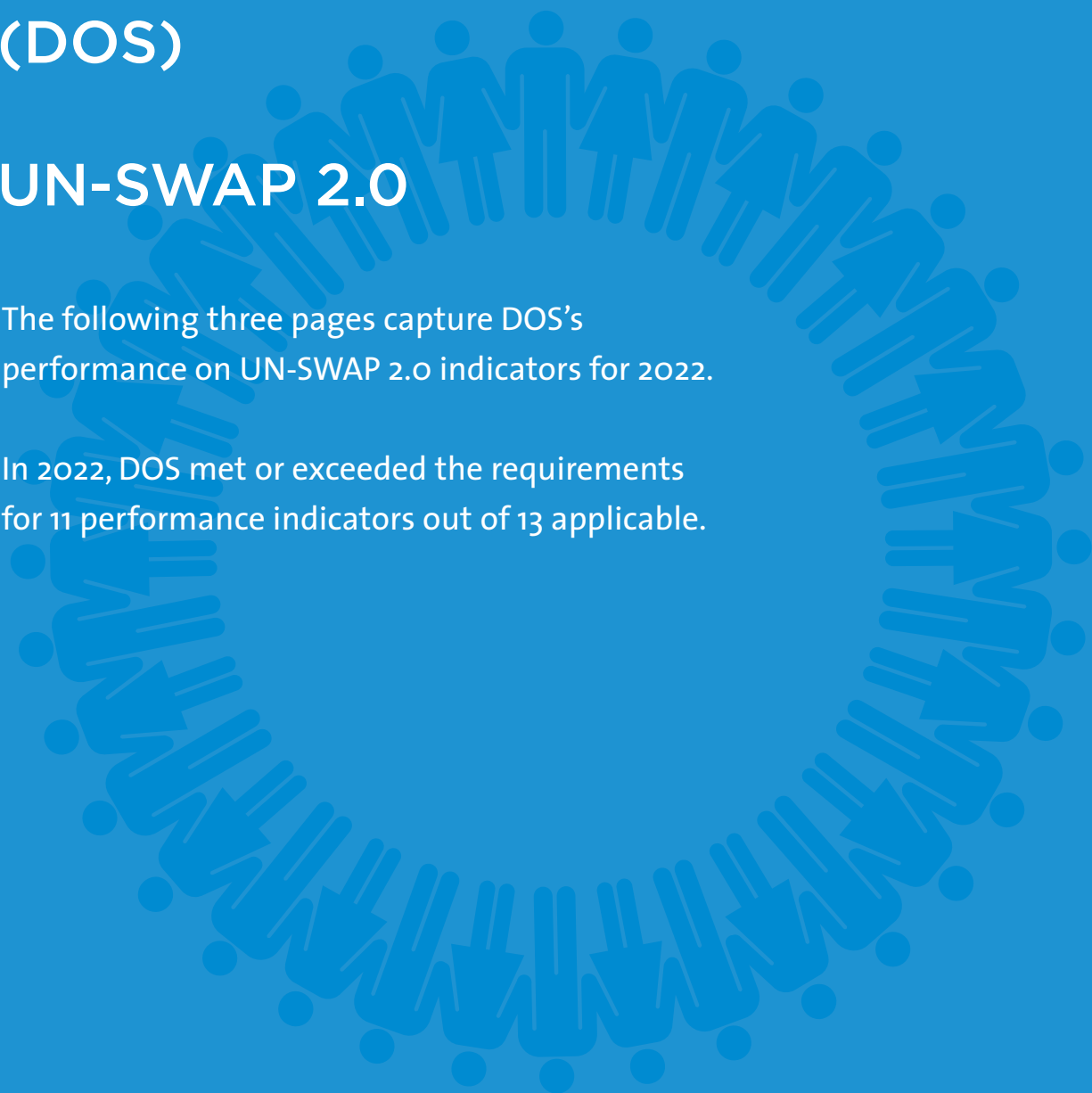

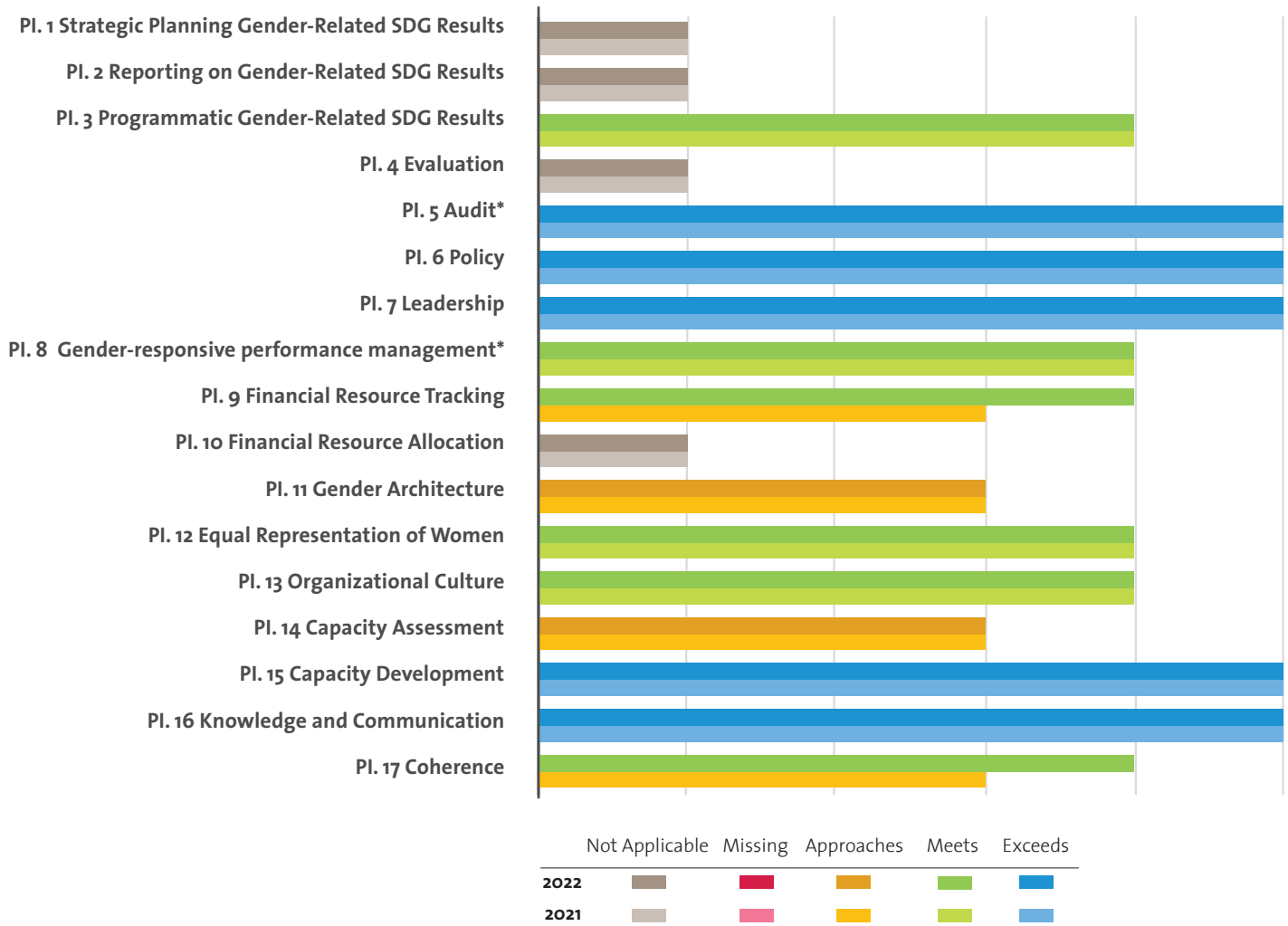
UN-SWAP 2.0

In 2022, DOS met or exceeded the requirements for 11 performance indicators out of 13 applicable.

PERFORMANCE HIGHLIGHTS IN 2022

Most significant gains

- In 2022, DOS exceeded the requirements for five performance indicators, and met the requirements for another six.
- Significantly, DOS newly met the requirements for two additional indicators in 2022, Financial resource tracking and Coherence.

Areas for improvement

- UN Women encourages DOS to focus attention on the two indicators rated as approaching, Gender architecture and Capacity assessment.

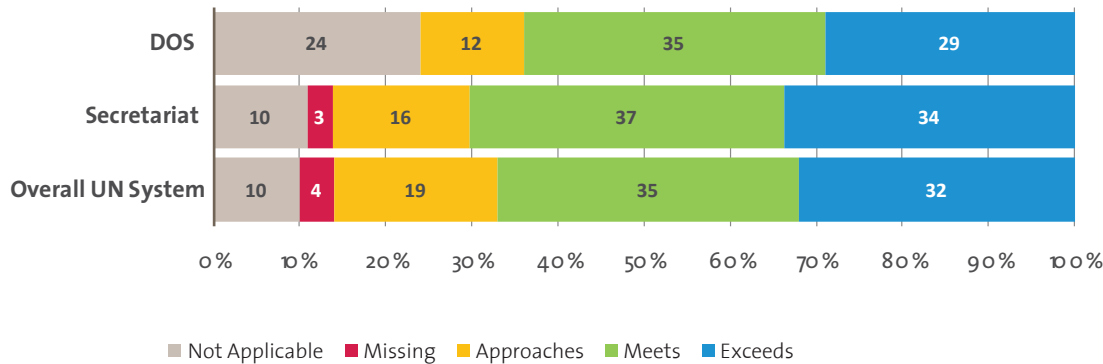

NOT APPLICABLE RATINGS OMITTED



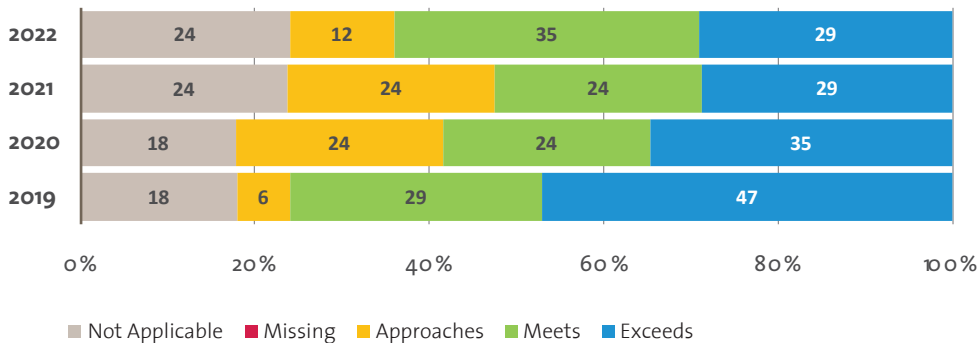
COMPARISON WITH THE SECRETARIAT AS A WHOLE AND THE OVERALL UN SYSTEM



In 2022, DOS performed slightly better than the average results of the overall UN system and of the Secretariat entities.

However, as an entity with a mainly administrative focus, significantly more indicators were rated as not applicable to DOS.

In 2022, DOS improved their UN-SWAP 2.0 performance by meeting requirements for more indicators than in 2021.
