
# UN-SWAP 2.0 PERFORMANCE 2022

- DSS exceeded the requirements for seven indicators and met the requirements for an additional four.
- Significantly, DSS improved performance across five indicators including, Evaluation, Policy, Capacity assessment, Capacity development and Coherence.


# Areas for improvement

• UN Women encourages DSS to focus on the remaining two applicable indicators not yet meeting requirements, Equal representation of women and Capacity assessment.



#### COMPARATIVE ANALYSIS FOR DSS




#### COMPARISON WITH SECRETARIAT ENTITIES AND THE OVERALL UN SYSTEM



In 2022, DSS met requirements for a slightly larger share of applicable indicators than the average results for UN Secretariat.

However, DSS rated twice the number of indicators as not applicable than the average.

# DSS, COMPARATIVE ANALYSIS OF RATINGS BY YEAR



Overall, DSS improved upon past performance by exceeding the highest number of indicator requirements since the start of UN-SWAP 2.0 reporting in 2018.
