
UN-SWAP 2.0 PERFORMANCE 2022

PERFORMANCE HIGHLIGHTS IN 2022

Most significant gains

- In 2022, UNECE exceeded the requirements for five performance indicators and met them for another seven.
- Impressively, UNECE newly met two critical indicator requirements: Financial resource tracking and Gender architecture.
- Significantly, UNECE also exceeded the Capacity assessment requirements, an improvement upon last year's performance.


Areas for improvement

 UN Women encourages UNECE to focus on the remaining four indicators rated as approaching requirements.



COMPARATIVE ANALYSIS FOR UNECE




COMPARISON WITH THE SECRETARIAT AS A WHOLE AND THE OVERALL UN SYSTEM



In 2022, UNECE achieved similar results to the average performance of the overall UN system and that of Secretariat entities.

Positively, UNECE deems more indicators applicable to their scope of work than the average of the UN System and of the Secretariat.
