

Most significant gains


- In 2022,WFP exceeded the requirements for nine indicators and met them for another four indicators.

Areas for improvement


- UN Women encourages WFP to focus efforts on the three indicators that remain approaching requirements: Financial resource tracking, Financial resource allocation and Equal representation of women.

COMPARATIVE ANALYSIS FOR WFP




COMPARISON WITH FUNDS & PROGRAMMES AND THE OVERALL UN SYSTEM
