
The following three pages capture UNECE's performance on UN-SWAP 2.0 indicators for 2018-2023.

In 2023, UNECE met or exceeded the requirements for 14 out of 16 applicable performance indicators.

PERFORMANCE HIGHLIGHTS IN 2023

Most significant gains

- UNECE exceeded the requirements for five performance indicators and met them for another seven.
- Impressively, UNECE also successfully met the requirements for two critical indicators: Organizational Culture and Coherence, that it had not met in 2022.

Areas for improvement

• UN Women encourages UNECE to focus on the indicator rated as missing requirements: Financial Resource Allocation and the indicator rated as approaching requirements: Equal Representation of Women.



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
COMPARISON OF OVERALL PERFORMANCE WITHIN THE UN SYSTEM, 2018-2023

PERCENTAGE OF RATINGS MEETING/EXCEEDING REQUIREMENTS (NOT APPLICABLE RATINGS OMITTED)




In 2018, UNECE was slightly outperforming the average of the UN Secretariat and the overall UN system. By 2023, this level of outperformance had significantly increased.





In 2023, UNECE met the requirements for significantly more indicators than the average of both the UN Secretariat and the overall UN system, while also assessing a greater number of applicable indicators.

COMPARISON OF RATINGS BY YEAR, ENTITY SPECIFIC, 2018-2023



From 2018 to 2023, UNECE made notable progress by "exceeding" or "meeting" the requirements for an increasing number of performance indicators.

In 2023, UNECE registered its strongest performance to date, although one indicator (Financial Resource Allocation) shifted from "approaching" to "missing" requirements.
