
UN-SWAP 2.0 PERFORMANCE 2018-2023

PERFORMANCE HIGHLIGHTS IN 2023

Most significant gains

- UN Global Compact exceeded the requirements for four indicators and met them for another nine indicators.
- Significantly in 2023, UN Global Compact newly met the requirements for the Gender Architecture indicator.

Areas for improvement

 UN Women encourages renewed focus on the two indicators rated as missing: Reporting on Gender Related SDG Results and Financial Resource Allocation and the only indicator currently approaching requirements: Policy.

In 2018, UN Global Compact outperformed the UN Secretariat entities and the overall UN System on average. In 2023, the entity continued to outperform the overall UN System and performed on par with the UN Secretariat entities.


COMPARISON OF RATINGS WITHIN THE UN SYSTEM, 2023

In 2023, UN Global Compact met the requirements for more indicators than the UN Secretariat and the overall UN System on average. Despite an overall strong performance, the entity missed the requirements for more indicators.

COMPARISON OF RATINGS BY YEAR, ENTITY SPECIFIC, 2018-2023



From 2018 to 2023, UN Global Compact consistently met and exceeded the requirements for a similar proportion of indicators.

In 2023, the entity improved upon its 2022 performance by meeting the requirements for one additional indicator (Gender Architecture), marking its strongest UN-SWAP 2.0 performance since 2019.
