Introduction

The Beijing Declaration and the Sustainable Development Goals, to which all countries and governments have committed, represent a model for comprehensive development and human progress. Algeria, which has achieved the Millennium Development Goals, has continued its endeavours and intensified its efforts toward development by 2030, based on a vision focused on social welfare and social justice within the context of a comprehensive development dynamic that has contributed to maintaining social stability.

Algeria has made positive progress at the regional and Arab levels by ranking first in the Maghreb with high human development rates according to the United Nations Development Programme (PNUD) report for 2021–2022. This is thanks to the implementation of several national development strategies and programmes in all fields aimed at eradicating poverty, strengthening social protection and achieving economic development at the national and local levels, which has improved the living conditions of the population, both women and men.

Development relies on a crucial and essential factor: human resources. With the belief that progress can be achieved by empowering all segments of society, women have been placed at the centre of all strategies and pillars outlined in the Algerian government's agenda. This reflects a deep conviction in their vital role and contributions to society – both in times of prosperity and in times of crisis. Through a comprehensive and participatory approach to managing public affairs and all aspects of life, Algeria continues to uphold the principle of equality between men and women in rights and duties, as enshrined in the Constitution.

Algeria has made the principle of non-discrimination between women and men a tangible reality, which is reflected in the fact that both benefit from all the measures and procedures taken by the government and the services and assistance provided, in the health, education, social, solidarity or economic fields. Some of these measures even apply as positive discrimination to women only.

In 2025, the international community will commemorate the thirtieth anniversary of the Fourth World Conference on Women and the adoption of the Beijing Declaration and Platform for Action in 1995. Ten years have passed since the adoption of the Sustainable Development Goals. Accordingly, all States are conducting comprehensive reviews at the

national level of the progress achieved and the challenges that appear in the implementation of the Beijing Declaration and Platform for Action. Consequently, Algeria, like all countries, and in embodiment of its commitments to international conventions, including the Beijing Declaration and Platform for Action, has submitted national reports on the progress made in implementing the Declaration, the latest of which was in 2018. In continuation of this endeavour, which aims to monitor and evaluate the progress made in women's empowerment over the past five years, this Beijing+30 national report has been developed. It was prepared with the involvement of various actors from ministerial sectors, national bodies, civil society and national associations active in the field with the aim of producing a comprehensive and integrated report that includes qualitative and quantitative data highlighting the progress made in empowering women and girls.
