





- Collaboration with 5 Ministries, Parliament, Central Statistics Organization, EVAW Commissions, more than 37 NGOs, Media, 2 Associations, Gawharshad and Kabul Universities
- Programme activities carried out in collaboration with public sector and civil society
 - 17 EVAW Commissions
 - 11 Women Protection Cntr
 - 5 Family Guidance Cntr
 - 1558 survivors of violence and 329 accompanying children gained access to protection, legal & health services in 2014







ADVOCACY: Need for Paradigm Shift

Population aged 15-24 years is estimated at 22.2%
Population aged 0-14 years is estimated at 42%

Tip the scales of rising extremism toward reception of gender equality values among youth

Need a conducive environment where young men and boys can openly acknowledge their support to gender equality

Redefine "honor" and "courage" to mean standing up for justice rather than male chauvinism
