REGIONAL OVERVIEW

LAC economic activity contracted by 7.4 percent in 2020, surpassing every other region in the world

WOMEN'S SITUATION

- Disempowered economically
- Affected politically
- Facing increase of VAWG



CONTEXT

- Austerity measures
- Trade and tourism paralysis
- Weaker social protection systems
- Gender-blind stimulus packages



- Deepened socioeconomic and sanitary crises
- Governance and political crises
- Social discontent may increase
- Heightened risks to civic space
- Greatest impact most severely women already left behind



AN EVIDENCE-BASED AND ADAPTIVE STRATEGY

- Over **70 policy briefs** produced
- 72,000 visits to online knowledge content
- 23M people reached on Twitter

Strategic communications for <u>cross-cutting inclusion of the</u> gender perspective in the crisis response

- Positioning of UN Women as a relevant voice on gender issues
- Consolidation of an active and responsive digital environment

Creation of the **gender section of the ECLAC COVID-19 Socioeconomic Observatory**

Monitors gender measures and priorities of 33 LAC countries



AN EVIDENCE-BASED AND ADAPTIVE STRATEGY

<u>Stronger and increased partnerships</u> with the UN, Development Banks, private sector, civil society, and governments of the region

Adaptive programming providing the **most relevant responses**

- Virtualization of activities, services, outreach, and capacity building
- Focus on addressing the most urgent needs of women on the ground



WOMEN'S LEADERSHIP IN COVID-19 RESPONSE

- Mobilized Ministers of Women in the framework of the Regional Conference on Women in LAC
- Over 40 civil society dialogues and informal consultations with 215 organizations and networks on COVID-19
- <u>Increased</u> leadership of <u>women human rights</u>
 <u>defenders</u>, peacebuilders, and young women



WOMEN'S LEADERSHIP IN COVID-19 RESPONSE

- Strengthened capacities of women in politics and decision-making
- Held strategic <u>conversations with electoral</u> <u>bodies</u> on COVID-19 impacts on political rights and 10 rescheduled elections

- <u>Capacities</u> of service providers

SOCIAL MEDIA/ CAMPAIGNS

- Social media campaigns and contents
 - Radio and TV programmes & spots
- Accessible materials in indigenous languages and for women with disabilities

INNOVATION

- Behavioral insights for prevention
- Artificial Intelligence to support victims
- Private partnerships to expand help lines and reaching wider groups
- Non-traditional spaces for reporting and help



EVAW: SOME COUNTRY EXAMPLES

BRASIL

2 films on VAWG in the context of the pandemic which reached more than **110** million viewers

COLOMBIA

630 stores set up safe spaces for reporting VAWG

MEXICO

More than 3,000 first responders trained to respond to issues of VAWG in emergency contexts

HONDURAS

<u>Protection and shelter</u> established for women's human rights defenders that suffered violence

JAMAICA

<u>Toll-free telephone lines</u> established to respond to women's emergency and care needs

ECONOMIC EMPOWERMENT IN ACTION

Care Economy as a pillar to building back better across the region



MEXICO: The Right to Dignified Care and the inception of the National Care System were established through the reform of articles 4 and 73 of the Constitution



CHILE: Approval of an emergency bill to extend postnatal support in the context of COVID-19 and a law that incorporates domestic workers into the unemployment insurance



ECUADOR: Collaborative design of "Transfers for Care" programmes that will be incorporated into national emergency response cash transfer packages



ECONOMIC EMPOWERMENT IN ACTION



Regional Action Coalition for the Economic Empowerment of Women with the Vice-President of Colombia



"Investors for Equality": regional innovative financing initiative



Strategic Alliance with Central American Bank for Economic Integration to guarantee substantive resources for women entrepreneurs



Close to **19,000 women, businesswomen and entrepreneurs** had access to digital skill building platforms and tools



ENGENDERING THE EMERGENCY RESPONSE

Creation of a Regional Roundtable on Gender in Humanitarian Action with the participation of 17 regional organizations

Direct support <u>35,000 women and people in high-risk situations</u>

Inclusion of use of sex disaggregated data and gender equality as a cross-cutting principle in 88% of Socio-Economic Response Plans (SERPs)






Progress in parity in the region could have a groundbreaking impact on the ability of countries to respond to the **COVID-19 crisis**
