


INTERNATIONAL ATOMIC ENERGY AGENCY (IAEA) UN-SWAP 2.0 PERFORMANCE 2019

The following two pages capture IAEA's performance on UN-SWAP 2.0 indicators for 2019.

In 2019, IAEA met or exceeded the requirements for 12 performance indicators out of 17 applicable, a significant improvement from the 2018 results.

PERFORMANCE HIGHLIGHTS IN 2019


Most significant gains

- 2019 has been a year of significant progress for IAEA. Most importantly, IAEA newly exceeded requirements for Leadership and Capacity Assessment, while approaching requirements for Financial Resource Tracking, which was previously missing.

Areas for improvement

- UN Women encourages IAEA to focus on the three indicators that approached requirements, and the two indicators that missed requirements.
- In particular, we emphasize the importance of Financial Resource Tracking and Allocation, as well as the Equal Representation of Women. Sustained financial resources and gender parity are essential criteria for achieving gender equality.

COMPARISON WITH THE SPECIALIZED ENTITIES AND THE OVERALL UN SYSTEM

- In 2019, IAEA exceeded requirements for significantly more indicators than the average for the Specialized entities.
- In addition, IAEA did not rate any indicators as not applicable.

IAEA, COMPARATIVE ANALYSIS OF RATINGS BY YEAR



In 2019, IAEA exceeded requirements for 5 indicators and met requirements for 7 indicators, thereby increasing performance in the meets and exceeds category by 11 percentage points. Additionally, the number of missing indicators has declined by half, from 24 per cent in 2018 to 12 per cent in 2019.
