


INTERNATIONAL MARITIME ORGANIZATION UN-SWAP 2.0 PERFORMANCE 2019

PERFORMANCE HIGHLIGHTS IN 2019

Most significant gain


- For the first time since reporting on the UN-SWAP 2.0, IMO exceeded requirements for 2 indicators: Programmatic Gender-Related SDG Results not Directly Captured in the Strategic Plan and Knowledge and Communication.

Areas for improvement


- IMO experienced a decline in performance whereby 6 indicators were missing requirements in 2019. UN Women encourages IMO to prioritize these 6 indicators along with the 8 that approached requirements.
- In particular, UN Women highlights the importance of Policy, Leadership, Financial Resource Tracking and Allocation, Gender Architecture and the Equal Representation of Women.

NOT APPLICABLE RATINGS OMITTED




COMPARISON WITH ENTITIES WITH A TECHNICAL FOCUS AND THE OVERALL UN SYSTEM

- In 2019, IMO met or exceeded requirements for fewer indicators than both the average for entities with a Technical Focus, and for the UN system at large.
- IMO is also missing requirements on a significantly greater percentage of indicators.

IMO, COMPARATIVE ANALYSIS OF RATINGS BY YEAR



- In 2019, for the first time, IMO exceeded requirements for 12 per cent of all indicators. The majority of indicators, 47 per cent, approached requirements, and 35 per cent missed requirements.
- While the percentage of indicators that approached requirements has decreased between 2019 and 2018, the amount of missing indicators has more than doubled.
