

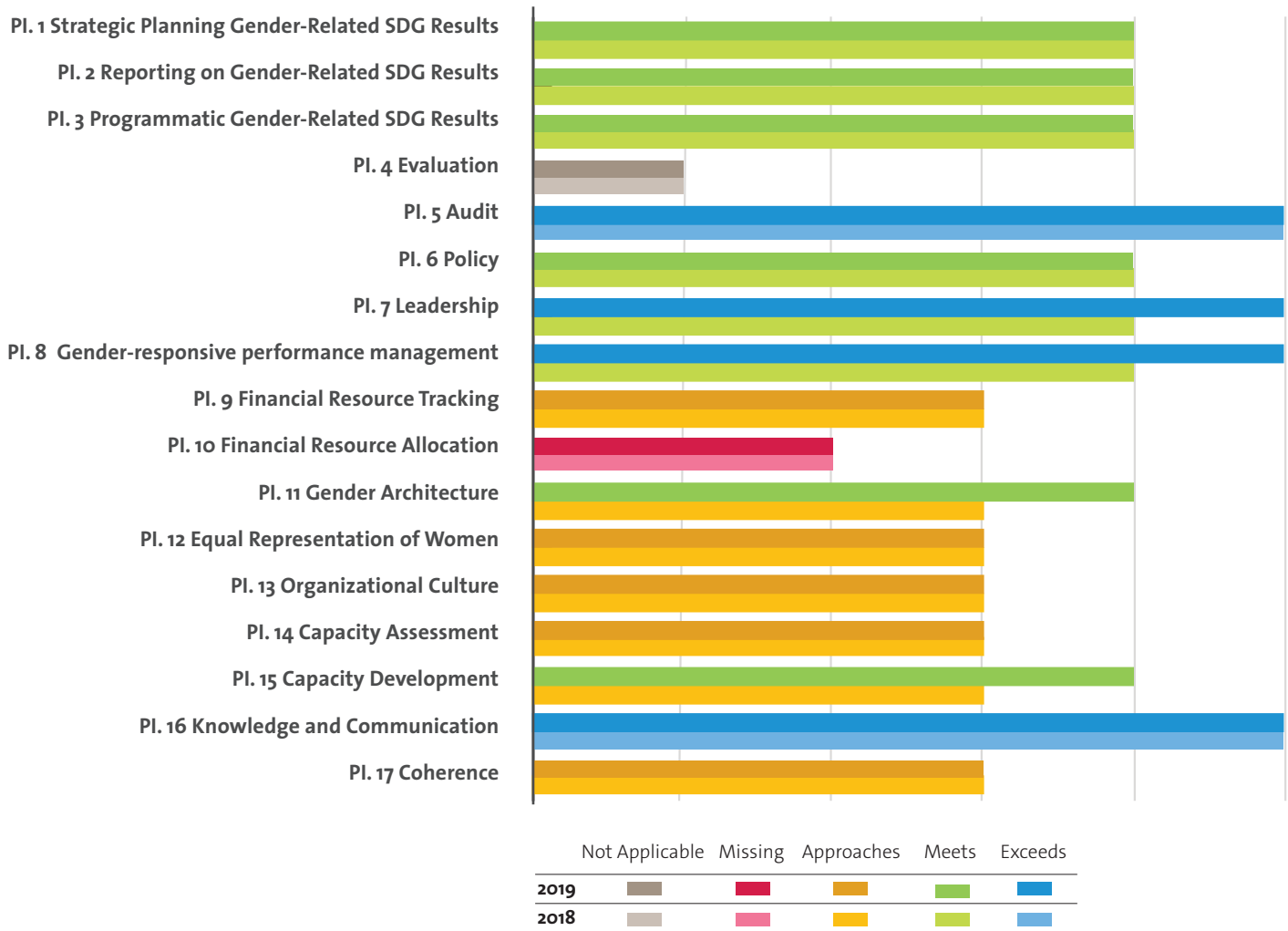

In 2019, ODA met or exceeded the requirements for 10 performance indicators out of 16 applicable, a significant improvement from 2018 results.

Most significant gains

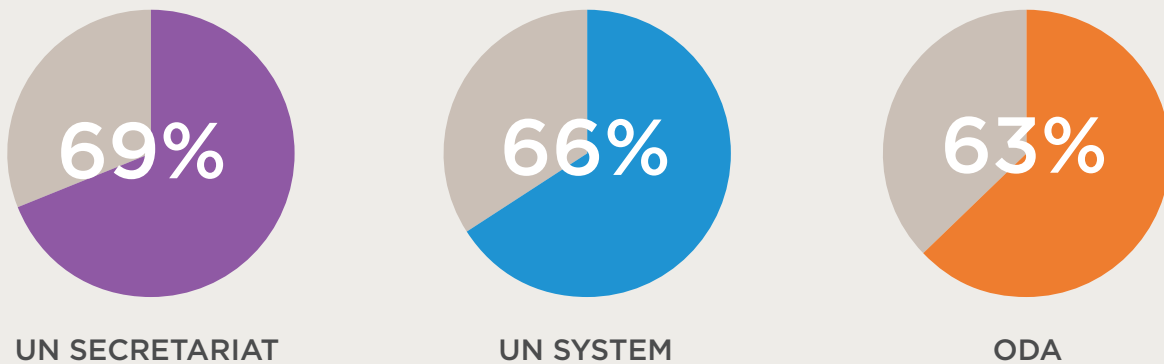
- In 2019, ODA met the requirements for Gender Architecture and Capacity Development. Fully resourced gender units and gender focal points are essential for continued improvements in ODA's gender work.
- Furthermore, exceeding requirements for the Leadership indicator is a significant step forward, as support of senior leadership and their commitment to gender equality is essential.

Areas for improvement

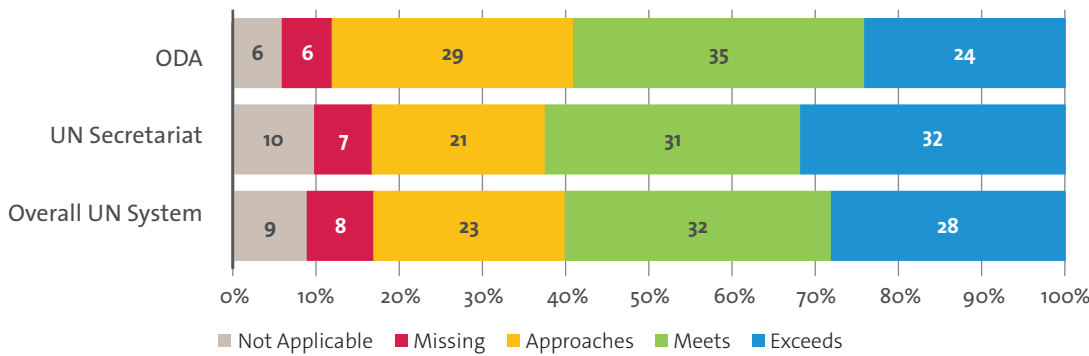
- UN Women encourages ODA to focus on the 5 indicators rated as approaching requirements, and on Financial Resource Allocation rated as missing.
- In particular, the Financial Resource Tracking and Allocation indicators are essential for achieving and accelerating progress on gender equality and the empowerment of women.

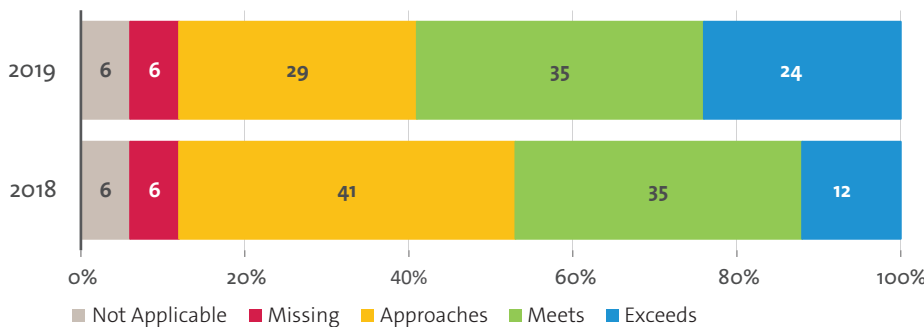


COMPARISON WITH THE SECRETARIAT AS A WHOLE AND THE OVERALL UN SYSTEM

- In 2019, ODA met and exceeded slightly less indicators than the average for the UN Secretariat as a whole
- ODA met and exceeded a similar amount of indicators as the average of UN System

ODA, COMPARATIVE ANALYSIS OF RATINGS BY YEAR



- ODA's performance shows great progress in comparison with 2018.
- In 2019, ODA met and exceeded requirements for 59 per cent of indicators, a significant increase from 47 per cent in 2018.
- This difference is due to a 12-percent-age point increase in ratings exceeding requirements.
