


# UNITED NATIONS ECONOMIC COMMISSION FOR EUROPE (ECE)

The following two pages capture ECE's performance on UN-SWAP 2.0 indicators for 2019.

In 2019, ECE met or exceeded the requirements for 11 performance indicators out of 16 applicable, an improvement from 2018 results.

PERFORMANCE HIGHLIGHTS IN 2019

Most significant gains

- In 2019, ECE met or exceeded the requirements for 11 indicators.
- Most significantly, ECE is now exceeding requirements on Evaluation and Gender-Responsive Performance Management. ECE continues to exceed requirements on the Policy indicator, an essential driver for overall progress.

Areas for improvement

- UN Women encourages ECE to prioritize the 5 indicators marked as approaching requirements, and in particular, the Financial Resource Tracking and Allocation indicators, as well as the Equal Representation of Women.

NOT APPLICABLE RATINGS OMITTED




COMPARISON WITH THE SECRETARIAT AS A WHOLE AND THE OVERALL UN SYSTEM

- ECE’s 2019 UN-SWAP 2.0 performance is in alignment with the average for the UN Secretariat and better than the UN System at large.
- Additionally, ECE is not missing requirements for any indicators.

ECE, COMPARATIVE ANALYSIS OF RATINGS BY YEAR



Between 2018 and 2019, ECE has increased performance in the exceeding requirements category by 11 percentage points, which is subsequently complemented by a 6 percentage point reduction in indicators approaching requirements.
