



UN-SWAP 2.0 PERFORMANCE 2019

The following two pages capture UNRWA's performance on UN-SWAP 2.0 indicators for 2019.

In 2019, UNRWA met or exceeded the requirements for 10 performance indicators out of 16 applicable, a significant improvement from the 2018 results.

PERFORMANCE HIGHLIGHTS IN 2019

Most significant gains


- In 2019, UNRWA improved performance on 3 indicators that were previously missing requirements: Strategic Planning and Reporting on Gender-Related SDG Results, now approaching and exceeding requirements, respectively, and Capacity Assessment, now meeting requirements.
- Furthermore, UNRWA is now meeting requirements for Gender Architecture.

Areas for improvement


- UN Women encourages UNRWA to prioritize Financial Resource Allocation, the only indicator missing requirements, and the five indicators approaching requirements, particularly the Equal Representation of Women.


SHARE OF RATINGS MEETING/EXCEEDING REQUIREMENTS OF ALL RATINGS





- In 2019, UNRWA met requirements for more indicators than the UN system as a whole and the average for the Funds and Programmes.

UNRWA, COMPARATIVE ANALYSIS OF RATINGS BY YEAR



- In 2019, UNRWA met or exceeded requirements for 59 per cent of the performance indicators, an 18 percentage point increase from 2018.
- The percentage of indicators missing requirements has declined from 24 per cent to only 6 per cent, or 1 indicator, in 2019.
