Australia's prioritization of regular resources to UN Women contributed to...




Strengthening the UN system's coordination on gender equality. In 2020, a record 70 United Nations entities (95 per cent) reported against the UN-SWAP 2.0. and gender equality remained the most common focus of United Nations joint programmes.



Support to parliamentary committees and women's caucuses contributed to the adoption of 29 gender-responsive initiatives, including gender quotas and gender-responsive legislation on COVID-19.



UN Women support to 114,243 women in 33 countries to strengthen technical, digital and financial skills and capacities to participate in the economy, including as entrepreneurs (69,332 from rural areas, 1,426 migrant women and 393 women with disabilities).



From 2011 to 2020, Australia has provided **USD 69.5 million** to UN Women's regular resources contributing to UN system coordination on gender equality as well as global norms, policies and standards, among several actions.

Australia's support to specific programmes resulted in...



Over 10,700 female vendors becoming members of Market Vendors Associations in Pacific island nations. These women are empowered to organize and participate in marketplace governance and decision-making, improving their socio-economic security and physical safety.



The development of the Association of Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN) guidelines that identify best practice approaches at regional, national and local levels on the main types and methods of violence against women and girls (VAWG) data collection and use. Generating reliable data and evidence to inform VAWG prevention and response strategies at national and regional levels.



In Jordan, working with Jordanian host communities and Syrian refugee communities to build food security and support self reliance through employment. Thirteen oases centres across nine governates provide livelihood opportunities and cash assistance, educational and skills-enhancing training.



Other contributions of **USD 111.4 million** have allowed UN Women to strategically focus on ending violence against women, peace and security, and women's economic empowerment.
