Machinery in the Ukraine to strengthen capacities and uphold CEDAW commitments as well as guide government development and implementation of the Gender Equality Plan for 2018.



The creation of enabling environments and safe

electoral processes free of violence against women in Haiti, contributing to the improvement of legal frameworks, outreach to civil society organizations and training for members of the media, judiciary and executive, including the police.



In 2018, with Canada's support, **UN Women** deployed 14 sexual violence investiga-

tors and gender advisers to eight international investigations. Evidence from investigations in Syria is now being used by the UN's International, Impartial and Independent Mechanism for Syria to develop cases against individual perpetrators.



Other resources of USD 45 million have allowed UN Women to strategically focus on women's economic empowerment as well as ending violence

against women and girls, peace and security, and women's political leadership and participation.
