# DENMARK: TOGETHER WE CAN

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## Denmark's prioritization of regular resources to UN Women contributed to...



Between 2018 and 2019, UN Women

supported the gender-responsive development of 16 new national development strategies. These strategies integrate mainstreaming of gender in situation analyses, development priorities, and monitoring and evaluation frameworks.



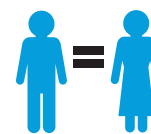
Planning and budgeting for empowerment and

equality in 28 countries, with a combined female population of over 1.2 billion, through increased budget allocations for gender equality.



UN Women managed 66 safe spaces and multi-purpose centres and

collaborated with over 200 women's organizations to support humanitarian response and resilience-building.



Since 2011 to date, Denmark has provided USD

**78.7 million** to UN Women's regular resources contributing to, among several actions, normative engagement with and within Member States to create, update and implement legislation which is gender equal.

## Denmark's support to specific programmes resulted in...



Over 2,000 women and men in South Sudan mobilized to engage in peacebuilding in

their communities and 200 male champions trained to speak out publicly about Violence Against Women and Girls in schools, churches and community events.



Increased availability of comprehensive service provision to survivors of violence in Ethiopia. A total

of 121 beneficiaries received access to holistic services including shelter, food, psychosocial counselling, legal assistance and medical support from the largest shelter in the country, resulting in their improved well-being, health status and enhanced self-esteem.



In the first year of implementation, the African

Girls Can Code Initiative (AGCCI) conducted a coding camp with 88 girls from 32 countries, selected 10 countries to pilot the mainstreaming of ICT, gender and coding in their education curricula, and identified tech clubs for partnerships in expanding digital literacy.



Other resources of **USD 25.7 million** have

allowed UN Women to strategically focus on humanitarian action, women's political leadership and participation, peace and security, and ending violence against women.
