FINLAND: TOGETHER WE CAN

Finland's prioritization of regular resources to UN Women contributed to...



UN Women continued efforts to strengthen the integration

of gender perspectives in intergovernmental processes and bodies, although COVID-19 impacts required significant adjustments, including to ensure business continuity.



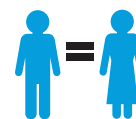
More than 6,800 women political aspirants increased leader-

ship and campaigning skills. They included over 700 indigenous and Afro-descendant candidates in Brazil trained on information and communications technology (ICT) and social media campaigning.



In 2020, UN Women supported 114,243 women in 33

countries to strengthen technical, digital and financial skills and capacities to participate in the economy, including as entrepreneurs (69,332 from rural areas, 1,426 migrant women and 393 women with disabilities).



From 2011 to 2020, Finland has provided

USD 133.5 million to UN Women's regular resources contributing to, among several actions, normative engagement with and within Member States to create, update and implement legislation which is gender equal.

Finland's support to specific programmes resulted in...

on UN Peacekeeping Operations. This is a significant part of the support for UN Women's work to increase women's leadership in peace, security and humanitarian response.



In Tanzania, a gender policy analysis of laws debated in Parliament

was undertaken by women's caucuses in the Parliament, leading to the enhanced capacity of women parliamentarians to advocate for gender quality and women's rights in legislation. This resulted in five laws having greater gender mainstreaming.



A desk review of 20 national

legislative systems in Jordan, has been used to develop evidence-based tools for advocacy and policy dialogue in support of the Syrian refugees now in Jordan.



Other resources of USD 61.7 million have allowed UN Women to

strategically focus on humanitarian action, women's political leadership and participation, peace and security, and women's economic empowerment.
