# NORWAY: TOGETHER WE CAN

## Norway's prioritization of regular resources to UN Women contributed to...



More attention to women, peace and security

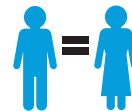
through five additional dedicated Security Council resolutions since the establishment of UN Women.



In 2020, UN Women supported 114,243 women in 33 countries to strengthen technical, digital and financial skills and capacities to participate in the economy, including as entrepreneurs (69,332 from rural areas, 1,426 migrant women and 393 women with disabilities).



In 2020, the Women's Peace and Humanitarian Fund increased its partners to over 300 across 23 countries, a nearly three-fold rise since 2019. The Fund's new COVID-19 emergency response window supported women's organizations with 42 projects in 18 crisis settings.



Since 2011 to 2020, Norway has provided **USD 124.3**

**million** to UN Women's regular resources contributing to, among several actions, ending violence against women, women's participation in peace and security processes and women's economic empowerment.

## Norway's support to specific programmes resulted in...



In Malawi, one set of the results achieved by the Women's Empowerment

Programme was the training of 728 participants, including 583 women, on business management, financial literacy and value addition. Additionally, 100 women from 10 cooperatives increased their incomes through the provision of beehives as part of business skills development and value addition.



Some 50,000 women and girls receiving information on where

and how to access the services - psychosocial support, legal aid and legal education - provided to South Sudanese refugee communities and host populations in the Adjumani and Yumbe districts of Uganda.



Piloting of blockchain technology to enhance the empowerment of

women and girls in humanitarian contexts and increase the effectiveness of humanitarian assistance for women and girls. Field testing in Kenya and an inter-agency pilot with the World Food Programme in Jordan yielded positive results and many lessons learned to enhance the process.



Other resources of **USD 136.1 million** have allowed UN Women to

strategically focus on women's economic empowerment, peace and security and humanitarian action, and ending violence against women and girls.
