# SWEDEN: TOGETHER WE CAN

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## Sweden's prioritization of regular resources to UN Women contributed to...



Since the establishment of UN Women, 75 countries,

home to 2.6 billion women and girls, have a stronger legal, regulatory and policy environment on women's economic empowerment.



In UN Women's first 10 years, 95 countries

or territories had adopted National Action Plans on women, peace and security.



In 2020, UN Women drew global attention to the increasing "shadow pandemic" of violence against

women and girls during COVID-19. Sixteen countries developed national action plans/strategies with a component addressing social norms, attitudes and behaviours.



Since 2011 to date, Sweden has

provided **USD 134.2 million** to UN Women's regular resources contributing to, among several actions, normative engagement with and within Member States to create, update and implement legislation which is gender equal.

## Sweden's support to specific programmes resulted in...



Technical support provided for the establishment and operation of Zimbabwe's Gender Commission.

Further technical support to government agencies on gender mainstreaming across a variety of sectors — trade unions, tourism, mining and banking.



Through the programme "Making Every Woman and Girl Count", UN

Women is supporting countries in their efforts to monitor gender equality in the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) and other national priorities. This has been particularly relevant over the last year as UN Women works with countries and partners to collect and publish timely and much needed data across sectors, such as health, employment, unpaid care work and food security, to inform the COVID-19 response.



Addressing the key drivers of gender-based vulnerability and enhancing human rights

through the mainstreaming of gender and human rights concerns in climate change and disaster risk reduction actions in Asia and the Pacific. Results include the integration of gender and social inclusion commitments in the updated National Determined Contributions developed by Cambodia and Viet Nam.



Other resource contributions of **USD**

**275.1 million** have allowed UN Women to strategically focus on disaster planning and humanitarian action, women's political leadership and participation, and peace and security.
