In 2019, 723 companies signed on to the

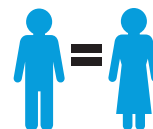
Women's Empowerment Principles.



Fifty-two countries, with a combined female population of over 1.5 billion, strengthened legislation to address violence against women and girls.



UN Women supported 548 civil society organizations and networks to influence peace processes.



Since 2011, the UK has contributed **USD 165.9 million** to UN Women's regular resources contributing to, among several actions, normative engagement at the intergovernmental level on women's economic empowerment in support of sustainable economic growth and achieving SDGs 1, 5, 8 and 13.

National Statistical Systems (NSS) building

capacity to produce quality, comparable, regular and accessible gender statistics in line with international standards in order that gender statistics are available, accessible, analyzed and used to inform policymaking, advocacy and accountability for delivering commitments on gender equality and women's empowerment.



UN Women's longer-term engagement and support

to increase Yemeni women's leadership in peace processes, with the aim of enhancing gender equality perspectives in peacemaking, peacebuilding and reconstruction processes.



Other resource contributions of **USD**

56.5 million have allowed UN Women to strategically focus on women's economic empowerment, women's political leadership and participation, peace and security and humanitarian action.
